MY LATE AUNT LORRAINE

Last Saturday in Campbellford, Ontario, I presided at the funeral of my late Aunt Lorraine Mahoney who was 81 years old and with her husband, my uncle Pat, had raised 12 children. The funeral was held in their home church of St. Mary of the Visitation. My late aunt was a force to be reckoned with and yet was always smiling and joyful and armed with jokes. She and her husband had also known the



cross in their lives when years ago one of their sons, Geoffrey, had died and over the years as well had two son in laws, David and Dennis, who had also had early passings.

In the words of condolences sent to the funeral home via website and the animated conversations at the reception following the funeral everyone was really saying the same thing about her – she was always so full of life and genuinely loved people. My aunt was also quite short in height and used to make jokes about

herself, particularly when all her children seemed to tower over her. She once had a shoe store in Campbellford and on a few occasions, when visiting and hanging around her store, if the phone would ring she would give us permission to answer it. One of my siblings (I don't remember which one) once answered saying, "Shorty's Shoes." My aunt just laughed.

At my father's funeral here at St. Leo the Great in July 2014, we were gathered in the parish hall for the reception and my aunt and others were standing around my mother's wheelchair. My

aunt, who always had fine wrinkles on her face and who described her own appearance to me once as looking like an unmade bed, said to everyone as she was looking at my mother; "Look at your mother's face and skin. Not a wrinkle on her. That's what ticks me off!" I think even my mother laughed at that, so infectious was my Aunt Lorraine's laugh and jovial way. Looking back she was a giant in so many ways and left a big footprint on the hearts of all who knew and remembered her. Aunt Lorraine used to be a lector at St. Mary of the Visitation church, which was also the home church of my mother whose family lived on a farm just outside of Campbellford, close to Myersburg where they went to school. Because of her stature she used to have a stool she would place just behind the lectern when it was her time to read. Even with the step stool you could

only see my Aunt's face above the book. In memory of this, one

of the lectors at her funeral used my aunt's stool to proclaim her

reading, (but I also observed that she needed it too).

The late St. John XXIII once said that "Every day is a good day to live and every day is a good day to die". That truth especially rings true when one has a living, every-day relationship with Jesus. It's not about appearing religious but in the way one lives their life. My Aunt, as was often said of her, would help anybody but if she had a beef with you she'd bring it to you square on. In that was found an honesty that said 'what you see is what you get'. My aunt would have been the first to admit and tell you that "she was no saint", and in such a beautiful way the Catholic Funeral liturgy addressed that reality as well when it refers repeatedly throughout the prayers, to asking God's mercy upon the soul and God's forgiveness of any sins she may have had. Saint, though she wouldn't have called herself, she still ranks up fairly high in my books when I think of the joy and laughter she spread wherever she went and in all circumstances whether it be an anniversary party or a funeral. She was one of those individuals who, when you entered a room full of people and spotted her face, you would naturally gravitate toward and be joyfully greeted with a big hug, a kiss and a jibe about something. My aunt had joy. I once wrote out a line that strangely came to me in a dream I had (of all places) which says, "Laughter is a fresh piece of joy when you're all out of gum". I know it sounds silly in its lack of profundity but it's also so true. The laughter of my Aunt was a reflection of an inner joy she had, one that sustained her through difficult times and in the everyday trials and challenges of life. We gave her the highest "send-off" we could in the celebration of her funeral Mass, commending her soul to the highest hope we humans have and has been promised to those who believe - joy with Christ forever! This is the Easter mystery and reality for our living.... and hers. (Fr. Charles)
