Simply ask hospital staff to inquire as to whether *Father Pius Alejo* is present in the hospital (or when he will be). If *Father Pius Alejo* is not available and there is an emergency requiring a Catholic priest, please call St. Leo the Great Parish at 905-655-3286 and when prompted, press "8" and leave your message. Fr. Charles will receive your message (if he is available) and return your call. If there is no emergency but you would like to speak to Fr. Welcome into the Church!

Last Saturday at the Easter Vigil we welcomed those candidates for baptism or entry into the Catholic Church and full communion with us through the Easter sacraments. Two of our RCIA members were catechumens which means they were not baptized and one of our members was baptized in the Anglican Church and wanted to become a Catholic. Sinthiya D'Souza and Anthony Barrett were both baptized, Confirmed and received their First Holy Communion at the Vigil while Lesley was received into the Church, Confirmed and received her First Holy Communion. Also among them, Anthony and Pamela Barrett's young son Anthony Jr. was baptized right after Anthony was and a young man, Marcello Gordon, who would have been away for Confirmation on May 16 was Confirmed, having already been baptized and made his First Communion.

THE PROMISE OF RESURRECTION

It is little wonder that Easter is celebrated for fifty days as we need time to recover what Christ has done for us in the terrible and glorious events of his Passion, Death and Resurrection. We live at this moment in the history of the world within the reality that Jesus is alive these two thousand years after the historical event of His promised Resurrection. The power that comes from the reality of the Resurrection does and should speak to our lives today and address those things that frightened the apostles then and frighten us now.

Depicted above is a painting by artist Kerelos Safwat called "First Day in Heaven". It was sent to me by a parishioner and the look on the woman's face says it all. Images are powerful but even the best of them can't really come close to a depiction of heaven. The picture below (by Bryan McGregor) shows Jesus holding a child who has died. Again, this is a powerful image projecting a young child that has died being with Jesus. One of the hardest forms of death is dealing with the death of a child. The most intimate relationship on the face of the earth is between a mother and her child or a child with their parents. When a child dies the parents so often feel that it should be them and not their young child. But to commend the soul of a child to Jesus is hard enough because the child cannot be seen any longer.



Images like this one help in some small way with the child being alive, sleeping in the arms of Jesus. Yet every fibre of my being says that whatever we can say heaven is, whatever we can do to somehow describe heaven – is not heaven. Heaven is so beyond

anything we can say about it. In all of the 73 books of the Bible we are not really given any description of heaven while at the same time it is mentioned 494 times in the NRSV. To me, it makes sense when God's Word itself doesn't attempt to reveal to mortals what is unfathomable to describe about the life that is to come. In our world's understanding of the heavenly we routinely make big mistakes about our portrayal of the life of heaven. Little children who have died are depicted as angels, but humans are not angels nor do they become angels. Angels are separate beings from humans and we are made lower than them and yet we are the stewards of all God has created. (Psalm 8:5) Angels don't take on humanity and humans don't take on becoming an angel. We are destined by God's invitation in Jesus to live forever with him but what we will become has not yet been revealed.

In 1 John 3:2-3 it says: "Beloved, we are God's children now; what we will be has not yet been revealed. What we do know is this: when he is revealed, we will be like him, for we will see him as he is." And all who have this hope in him purify themselves, just as he is pure." Many people have had what are called NDE's, Near Death Experiences, though it can't be proven that the soul leaves the body for a time and travels somewhere else. What I have always found as fascinating is what those individuals who have quietly kept their experience to themselves have said about what they learned from their experience. They are not concerned in the least about whether people believe them or not but their gleaning from their experience tells us so much about what we don't know. Some people who have had a NDE relate that life as we know it isn't all that complicated but that *WE* have made it so. Others have tried to describe what they saw but there was nothing on earth that they could compare it to. Some have described the colours of what their eyes saw and that there were colours in heaven that are outside of our spectrum of colour on earth. The materials that people saw were indescribable and no description using human, earthly language could convey adequate explanations of them. As the quote from 1 John above states, "what we will be has not been revealed". If God hasn't revealed something it cannot be known or discovered. The revelation of heaven is awaiting us and just as we cannot understand what Jesus looks like we will become like him which will enable us to see him.

The other night I had a wee small inkling of heaven as I visited my mother at the nursing home who has had Dementia for the past 18 years. She had said nothing to me throughout my visit while I gave her Communion and prayed with her and after while we watched another episode of *The Walton's*. However, as I was about to get ready to leave, I said to my mother who was comfortably laying in her bed, "Momma, I'm going to have to say goodnight to you now." Then I said to her, "I suppose that is what you and dad said to each other before you went to sleep each night." Then I mimicked what they would have said, saying, "Good night, Johnny" and dad replying back, "Good night, Margaret." "Änd just think, mom", I said, "one day soon you're going to see papa again and you won't ever have to say goodbye or good night ever again because you will never be parted. You will be there in Paradise with Jesus, who must be so beautiful to look at, and dad, and your baby Michael, you lost and never got to hold fifty four years ago. You will live in peace and joy with all the Saints and those people who loved Jesus here on earth." My mom, smiled and gave a bit of a chuckle.

I know she is waiting for it and believes it too. (Fr. Charles)
