PARISH REGISTRATION:


All families attending St. Leo's are requested to register with the parish. Registration forms (Welcome Cards) are available in the vestibule of the church.

LOCAL HOSPITALS AND EMERGENCY PASTORAL VISITATION

If you or someone in your family is in the Oshawa, Whitby or Port Perry Hospitals and would like to have a priest (for serious reasons) visit the person who is sick for Anointing of the Sick, Last Rites, Confession or Communion, please note that there is a full-time Catholic Priest assigned to these three hospitals at various times of the week. Simply ask hospital staff to inquire as to whether *Father Victor Amole* is present in the hospital (or when he will be). If Father Victor is not available and there is an emergency requiring a Catholic priest, please call St. Leo the Great Parish at 905-655-3286 and when prompted, press "8" and leave your message. Fr. Charles will receive your message (if he is available) and return your call. If there is no emergency but you would like to speak to Fr. Charles, please call the parish office and leave a message with the parish secretary at 905-655-3286 x 101.

This last week has seen many pledges come in which has driven our reported total from last Sunday from \$323,500 to meeting and now exceeding our goal. This is truly amazing, just like the generosity of our parishioners.

Now that we've reached our goal just remember that our campaign isn't over yet. For all the money raised above our target amount of \$390,000. our parish will keep 75% to be used toward our hiring of a full-time Youth Minister, replacement of our current church lighting for LED lighting as well as paying down the debt on our parish.

And don't worry, if you have already made a pledge to the campaign, there will be a box for you to tick off on the pledge card to indicate "Amen! I've already given."

PREPARED?

It seems that no matter how most people lived or the circumstances of their death, many of the dead become canonized upon their departure from this world in the remembrance of those who eulogize them. Perhaps this is a strange form of mercy from the living toward the dead. Or perhaps our memories sometimes fail us when taken over by grief and the finality of human death or we're ready to give the benefit of the doubt.

The readings for the past few Sundays have spoken to us about the importance of being ready whether the Lord comes for us in the night or day or on the last day. Never mind the details, the essential thing is that we come to understand that the Lord will return to the earth one day, as He said. Therefore, since no due-date is given us, it is crucial we understand the significance of this present moment preparation; being prepared to meet Jesus one day, face to face, which, for all we know, could be today.



I just read a news story this past week about a young man named Matthew Jackson who was a former native of Ontario and was living in California. I say 'was' because 28-year-old Matthew died in a tragic car accident on November 11th. But his tragic death wasn't the reason he was in the news. Just the day before, less than

24 hours before the accident that claimed his life, Matthew was in a store checkout line when a woman in front of him, whose child was cranky and crying, realized she had forgotten her debit card at home and her credit card was declined. Matthew asked if he could pay and, at first, she refused but he insisted he pay for her items which totaled around \$200. He only asked that she pay it forward. The woman inquired later about him and learned that he worked at a nearby gym. When she called to ask about him she was met with tears and knew something was wrong. Matthew's employer said Matthew was engaged to be married and that he was just that kind of a person every day — thoughtful, considerate and kind.

It seems Matthew's good deed is already coming full circle. Jackson's sister and brother-in-law were on their way to his memorial service when they stopped at a restaurant. When they went to pay the bill someone had already covered it.

Jesus said, "Whatsoever you do to the least of my brothers and sisters you did to me."

Now the woman in the store who was helped by Matthew's generosity is encouraging others to pay it forward to others. She said, ""This is what the world needs to hear - this is what I want my kids to see. I want my kids to recognize that there are still really, really good people out there."

In his relatively short 28 years of life on this earth Matthew Jackson lived his last day as he seems to have lived them all-with love and care for his fellowman.

Matthew, may you receive the reward for your life on this earth in God receiving you as you received so many others in his name.
