EULOGY FOR A MOTHER

Margaret Mary Forget 1931 – 2020

(My mother's funeral took place this past Tuesday morning and my brother, David, gave the following Eulogy.)

Good morning. My name is David Forget and I'm Margaret's youngest son. I am honoured to be sharing her eulogy with you today. On behalf of my siblings: Jim, Jay, Marianne, Fr. Charles, Mark and last but certainly not least Paula, thank you for coming to surround my mother with prayer at this Mass as we commend her soul back to the God who made her.



As a family, we certainly came from good stock – parents who loved us and had a strong faith in God. In particular, my mother grew up in a large Irish family of nine children on a farm in Campbellford, Ontario. They were taught early on about their Catholic faith and the importance of hard work, discipline and being good people. Our Mom shared those same important principles with us.

Growing up, our Mom stayed at home with us. My Dad wasn't always around because he would be working long hours. So, she took on the role of mother, leader, teacher, moralist and disciplinarian to name but a few. Later in life, as a family, we would often talk about how our Mom managed it all. But somehow she did and raised us "rotten kids" as she would say, rather well too.

My mother was a people person and as noted in her obituary, she valued the underdog, the lonely, the alcoholic, the unborn, and the forgotten. My father, at the time of his death in 2014 was a 53-year-member of Alcoholics Anonymous. My mother was at his side at virtually every meeting he ever attended and although not an alcoholic herself, she helped many people over the years to achieve and maintain sobriety. She was vigilant and never gave up on people.

My mother was never one for fussy things. She didn't place a high value on fancy clothes, jewelry, fine china and other extravagances ... what some might consider the finer things in life. Although, she never left the house with a hair out of place or her lipstick. As she used to say, "you just never know who you're going to meet!" What was important to her was her family and those around her especially those who needed assistance. Her faith was her foundation.

As us rotten kids grew up and moved away from home, Mom began working for ParaMed Health Services, a job she truly enjoyed. She had endless patience and compassion for the elderly and those suffering from dementia. Her "three houraday" job, as my Dad used to call it, would turn out to be much longer simply because my Mom had a hard time not helping out other residents, even when they weren't under her care even when it was past her time to go home. It's ironic in some

ways that she would be plagued with dementia herself, being diagnosed early in life in her late 60's.

Back in 2003, I was in a transition point in my life and asked my Dad if it would be OK if I could come and live back at home with him and Mom for a year. He said sure. That one year turned into five. Looking back now, I feel so honoured to have spent that time with my parents but in particular with my Mom who at the time was manifesting many of the telltale characteristics of early dementia which included repeating herself, asking the same questions over and over again, confusion, frustration, being upset. But through all of this, my Mom's tenacity and kindness always shone through. When I would leave for work, she would always insist in getting the door for me and say "TGIF!". Every day was Friday for her ... not a bad way to be in the end.

I heard this quote recently and it resonated with me ... "Do not seek death. Death will find you. But seek the road which makes death a fulfilment". My Mom always sought that road, a road that wasn't always popular or easy but in the end, she lived by her principles and was unwavering. She died peacefully surrounded by her family that loved her and rallied to ensure that her every need was met and that she wouldn't be alone. That was the legacy that she created and the legacy that we, her family will pass on.

We love you and we miss you terribly already. But, we are buoyed up knowing that you are with Jesus and Dad, the loves of your life. Rest in peace Mama.

Margaret's heart, by the providence and will of God, began to beat while in her mother's womb 32,485 days ago; a heart that had learned of love and gave love to her parents, Gordon Mahoney and Rose (Collins). It endeared her to 8 brothers and sisters; Edward, Charles, Betty, Don, Mary and Gordie who have gone to the Lord and is survived by - Helen (d. Owen) Jennings and Pat (d. Lorraine). It led her to fall in love with her late husband of 62 years – John Maurice Forget – and the fruit of their marriage gave birth to 8 children: Jim (Pauline), Jay (Heather), Marianne (Robert) Malloy, Rev. Fr. Charles, Mark (Sharon), Michael (d. 1962), David and Paula (Paul) Podesta. She loved and was loved by her 14 grandchildren, 20 greatgrandchildren, 2 GG grandchildren and so many relatives and friends in the span of her life. Principled, kind and having a plethora of wise sayings, Margaret gave away far more than she ever received and that beating heart had a soft spot for the underdog, the alcoholic, the unborn, the forgotten and the lonely and she possessed a great sense of humour in all things. Above all, she had a restless heart for God in Christ and in this earthly life made her home in Him. Over the last 22 + years Dementia robbed her of her memory but she has always known that the God who loved her would never forget her. That loving, serving heart of a disciple stopped beating on Thursday, February 6 and is now whole in the promise of Eternal Life with Jesus Christ. Our family has been blessed by the tremendous love and care afforded our late mother and predeceased father by the staff at Fairview Lodge Nursing Home in Whitby.
