ABORTION AND MOTHERS

In the issue of abortion next to the fact that the unborn child is forgotten and modern society has switched from any emphasis on the child to the woman in talk of 'reproductive rights', 'my body, my choice' and a 'woman's right to choose' in general, seldom is there talk of the mothers, for a woman who is pregnant is in fact, a mother. I

have often thought that while it is important that we never let down our guard in defense of the defenseless and the innocent and as crucial as it is to continue to pray, particularly at Holy



Mass, for the unborn and for lawmakers and politicians to have a change of heart which defends the unborn baby boys and girls, we say little about help to the mothers.

The Catholic Church has put its money where its mouth is in that she has not only courageously spoken out against the holocaust of abortion but has led the fight to end abortion altogether. Some individuals within the Church have literally dedicated much of their life to the right to life of the unborn and many groups have organized to lead in a more collective form of battle in the war on words. Religious communities, such as the Sisters of Life in Toronto and elsewhere have dedicated their mission to assisting pregnant mothers who might be contemplating abortion while providing for their needs and supporting them with love, assistance and prayer.

It is important that both the unborn child and the mother herself, as well as the fathers, have a voice which speaks for them and hands that will help them when tempted to choose the easy, oft-travelled road which leads to the ending of the child's life and a life of heartache and remorse for the mothers who are forgotten and left alone long after anti-life forces have used them for their own propaganda and then ignores them when they are finished with them.

It would be difficult for those who have had an abortion to come to church and hear the intercessions with mention of children who have been aborted or to hear mention of abortion in homilies. Yet those who have come with heavy heart, remorse and true contrition to the beautiful forgiveness of Jesus in the Sacrament of Reconciliation and have received penance and absolution will become different people who have experience the healing power of Jesus as the priest prays with the mother and commits the child's soul to the loving embrace of Jesus.

Diary of an Unborn Child

The following article was written about forty years ago by an unknown author but makes the personhood of the unborn child real and alive to us, though in more recent years many Church leaders have grown silent in speaking out on abortion while others more luke warm have cited that there are other more important issues at hand. But the constant rhythm of our own heart beats should be the drum that calls us to battle to work toward stopping this ugly affront to the human person which also greatly but so often unseen, affects the lives of countless women as well as men.

The child speaks to us from the womb.....

September 19:

Today my life began. My parents do not know it yet, but it is I already. And I am to be a girl. I shall have blond hair and blue eyes. Just about everything is settled though, even the fact that I shall love flowers.

October 3:

Some say that I am not a real person yet, that only my mother exists. But I am a real person, just as a small crumb of bread is yet truly bread. My mother is. And I am.

October 7:

My mouth is just beginning to open now. Just think, in a year or so I shall be laughing and later talking. I know what my first word will be: MAMA.

October 9:

My heart began to beat today all by itself. From now on it shall gently beat for the rest of my life without ever stopping to rest! And after many years it will tire. It will stop, and then I shall die.

October 17:

I am growing a bit every day. My arms and legs are beginning to take shape. But I have to wait a long time yet before those little legs will raise me to my mother's arms, before those little arms will be able to gather flowers and embrace my father.

October 27:

Tiny fingers are beginning to form on my hands. Funny how small they are! I'll be able to stroke my mother's hair with them.

November 4:

It wasn't until today that the doctor told mom that I am living here under her heart. Oh, how happy she must be! Are you happy, mom?

November 9:

My mom and dad are probably thinking about a name for me. But they don't even know that I am a little girl. I want to be called Kathy. I am getting so big already.

November 24:

My hair is growing. It is smooth and bright and shiny. I wonder what kind of hair mom has?

November 27:

I am just about able to see. It is dark around me. When mom brings me into the World it will be full of sunshine and flowers. But what I want more than anything is to see my mom. How do you look, mom!

December 8:

I wonder if mom hears the whispering of my heart? Some children come into the World a little sick. But my heart is strong and healthy. It beats so evenly: tup-tup, tup-tup. You'll have a healthy little daughter, mom!

December 12:

Today my mother killed me.
