## LOCAL HOSPITALS AND EMERGENCY PASTORAL VISITATION

If you or someone in your family is in the Oshawa, Whitby or Port Perry Hospitals and would like to have a priest (for serious reasons) visit the person who is sick for Anointing of the Sick, Last Rites, Confession or Communion, please note that there is a full-time Catholic Priest assigned to these three hospitals at various times of the week. Simply ask hospital staff to inquire as to whether *Father Pius Alejo* is present in the hospital (or when he will be). If Father Pius Alejo is not available and there is an emergency requiring a Catholic priest, please call St. Leo the Great Parish at 905-655-3286 and when prompted, press "8" and leave your message. Fr. Charles will receive your message (if he is available) and return your call. If there is no emergency but you would like to speak to Fr. Charles, please call the parish office and leave a message with the parish secretary at 905-655-3286 x 101.

#### THROUGHOUT LENT IN OUR PARISH:



# PREPARING FOR LENT... NOW.

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On Wednesday March 1<sup>st</sup> Lent for 2017 begins with two Masses that day in the parish with the distribution of ashes. The mandate from Christ as we receive blessed ashes is that of our whole

life in following Jesus: "Turn away from sin and be faithful to the Gospel".

#### "TURN AWAY FROM SIN ... "

This serious Lenten is an invitation which serves to remind us that to sin means that with full knowledge and will we have chosen to do that which we know is contrary to the will of God. We have in fact turned to sin as evidenced by our weakness, habit, or the will to give in to temptation and, in doing so, have effectively turned away from God. When we sin, God doesn't get mad at us and turn away from us in disgust, rather, when we sin we consciously turn away from God. God does not move in his relationship with us – he is always there, always with us, but when we sin we move away from God's love, call and grace. Yet where sin abounds, grace all the more abounds; grace being God's free gift of himself to us, his free help, his remedy for us to find our way out of sin.

Many have said that our contemporary times have lost a sense of sin, and I would tend to agree mainly due to my own, perhaps reluctant admission, that I sin and that I am a sinner. As a priest I can assist others in dealing with sin principally because I am a sinner myself. Yet qualifying as a sinner isn't the only reason that I can speak about human sin. I must speak about it because Christ addressed it, not only with his words of teaching but principally through his death on the Cross. Human sin was and is so serious that Jesus took it upon himself – all of it – and put it to death in his death on the Cross. It is because of sin and what sin had brought into the world that was the reason for Jesus' coming to us as Messiah and Saviour. He is the Saviour because he saves us from sin.

The remedy for sin is forgiveness which comes from God. If God is love itself then forgiveness from God is a sign of that great love that longs to see us whole, forgiven, reconciled and restored in him. St. John's Gospel tells us of just how great God's love for us is in Romans 5:8: *"But God proves his love for us in that while we still were sinners Christ died for us."* God has not only shown us this tremendous love but he died for us, proof of just how great his love really is.

#### "BE FAITHFUL TO THE GOSPEL"

The second part of the words which accompany the marking with ashes is to "be faithful to the Gospel". The word 'Gospel' means Good News, but what is this good news? It is nothing less than the awesome news that we don't have to die but have the opportunity to live forever with God in heaven. How did this happen? Again, when Jesus died on the Cross in your and my place. But it isn't just given to us like water is poured into a glass. God wants us to ask for it, to desire it, to really want it and, if we do, he will give it to us in the bestowal of abundant, blessed life in this world and forever in the world that will never end – eternal life.

So the invitation to be faithful to the promise of God means to authentically live out each day we are given according to God's plan and purpose. A dog is considered faithful because it never relents in its loyalty and love for us. We are faithful as humans to our relationships as wives, husbands, children, single people, widows and widowers and friends when we are constant in our loyalty to those people in our lives and in our unspoken, unwritten promise to be true, honest and of service to them. That's what God wants us to do first and foremost in our highest relationship with him; to know and follow the commandments, to love others and ourselves as he himself has loved us, to seek the good and do the good, to forgive

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others and ourselves and to seek reconciliation with one another and ultimately with God in the areas of our life where we have sinned and broken our relationships. If we are honest with ourselves we will admit that this task of faithfulness is, quite frankly, impossible to achieve except for the wondrous and real help of God. It's called 'grace'; unmerited, undeserved, and ours for the asking. Jesus will help us as we wander through our Lenten landscape. It's a promise. (*Fr. C.*)
