LOCAL HOSPITALS AND EMERGENCY PASTORAL VISITATION

If Father Pius Alejo is not available and there is an emergency requiring a Catholic priest, please call St. Leo the Great Parish at 905-655-3286 and when prompted, press "8" and leave your message. Fr. Charles will receive your message (if he is available) and return your call. If there is no emergency but you would like to speak to Fr. Charles, please call the parish office and leave a message with the parish secretary at 905-655-3286 x 101.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK WHAT IS IT?

Often enough when a parishioner or any Catholic for that matter tells me of some more serious illness or disease they have or informs me that they are going for some form of surgery, as soon as I recommend that they receive the Anointing of the Sick, they ask, "Isn't that for when you are dying?" Actually, in a word, no.

The sacrament for those who are dying was originally called, Extreme Unction, meaning that it was the anointing and prayers over those who are dying or close to or in danger of death. Today it is generally called the Last Rites signifying the ushering of the soul into the Kingdom of God with pravers, the Sacrament of Reconciliation, anointing and Communion, if possible. A Catholic who is dying (or a family member or friend) should request the Last Rites as soon as the possibility of death may be imminent but not at the very last minute. While in emergency situations the last minute retrieval of a priest to administer the Last Rites to a dying person may be necessary, outside of these cases it is more beneficial and prudent to request this last sacrament when the possibility of death is evident. Last Rites is a sacrament not intended for those who have already died but for the living to prepare them for the hope of heaven.

Anointing of the Sick, however, is a beautiful, powerful prayer of healing for those who are seriously sick in mind or body. if one is preparing for surgery, has become seriously ill or has been diagnosed with some form of disease or if they are experiencing serious mental trauma or affliction.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church states in 1500 and 1501:

Illness and suffering have always been among the gravest problems confronted in human life. In illness, man experiences his powerlessness, his limitations, and his finitude. Every illness can make us glimpse death.

Illness can lead to anguish, self-absorption, sometimes even despair and revolt against God. It can also make a person more mature, helping him discern in his life what is not essential so that he can turn toward that which is. Very often illness provokes a search for God and a return to him.

In 1503 it states: Christ's compassion toward the sick and his many healings of every kind of infirmity are a resplendent sign that "God has visited his people" and that the Kingdom of God is close at hand. Jesus has the power not only to heal, but also to forgive sins; he has come to heal the whole man, soul and body; he is the physician the sick have need of. His compassion toward all who suffer goes so far that he identifies himself with them: "I was sick and you visited me." His preferential love for the sick has not ceased through the centuries to draw the very special attention of Christians toward all those who suffer in body and soul. It is the source of tireless efforts to comfort them.

At the Mass of Anointing and Healing on Thursday February 9th in our parish (7 pm.) in the highest form of prayer in the Church – the Mass – we will pray for and anoint all who desire God's healing power for sickness, disease, addiction and any area where the healing of God is desired. Be open to this 2000 year old prayer for Christ's healing power. *(Fr. Charles)*
