#### LOCAL HOSPITALS AND EMERGENCY PASTORAL VISITATION

Fr. Charles will receive your message (if he is available) and return your call. If there is no emergency but you would like to speak to Fr. ### **Christmas, Clean-Up and Thanks**

Arriving at church this weekend makes it abundantly clear that Christmas is over and the decorations are all taken down and packed away for another year. Of course, the decorations don't disappear by themselves but as a result of some hardworking people who came last Sunday to attend to that less glamorous task of removing the adornments of Christmas from the church and sanctuary. It's always kind of exciting to get out the decorations and create the beautiful Christmas scene that transforms our sanctuary into the place of the Manger scene, the travelling Magi, the Poinsettia tree and the splendid colours of the poinsettia plants arranged in clusters near and around the altar area. It's obviously a bit of a downer to take everything down and apart and pack it away until next Christmas. I think parishioners feel the same thing at home in the big difference felt in decorating for Christmas and dismantling it. Few are interested in the second part.

We have never had so many comments on the appearance of the sanctuary as we did this year. One woman told me that in all her life she has never seen a church decorated as magnificently as ours this year. Every year we make slight changes to groupings of flowers, the location of the many trees both lit and unlit and this year added the poinsettia tree. Years ago a Mr. Ernie Allard skillfully made the wood structure of the tree and it was used for many years until the parish decided it no longer wanted it. I was contacted and happily accepted it for use in our church. In a large church edifice like ours you can't decorate with small things but need large items to fill and beautify so much empty space. The poinsettia tree looked magnificent with the statue of Our Lady beside it.

#### **POWERFUL SYMBOLISM**

Yet the decorations do so much more than simply appeal to the eye, they are filled with meaning. In fact, one parishioner with a theological background remarked how he was impressed by the clear layout which spoke about the three comings of the Lord, which admittedly I hadn't intended nor even thought about. He pointed out that the first coming of Christ was obviously evidenced in the large manger scene representative of the birth of Jesus Our Saviour and the adorned altar at the center of the sanctuary is where Christ comes to us in the present in the great mystery and gift of the Eucharist, and the statue of Our Lady with the large poinsettia tree represents the Second Coming of the Lord heralded by the messages of and the image of Mary, the Mother of God. Christ's three comings in history, mystery and at the end of all things was the unintended but truthful scene of the sanctuary this Christmas. And the addition of the stunning white and bountifully decorated Christmas tree in royal colours right next to the manger contained the proclamations of the various names of Jesus - "Wonderful Counsellor, Mighty God, King of Kings, Son of David, Mighty Lord, Prince of Peace" among others. Our communal celebration of the birth of Jesus was greatly enhanced by the fitting setting of the sanctuary this year.

I would like to acknowledge and thank the following people who worked very hard for 3  $\frac{1}{2}$  hours last Sunday afternoon in dismantling the beautiful and meaningful symbols of Christmas.

# 100<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of Our Lady of Fatima

This year marks the 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the apparitions of the Blessed Virgin Mary to three shepherd children in Fatima, Portugal and on Saturday May 13<sup>th</sup> will mark the anniversary of the first apparition of Mary to the children on the same date in 1917. As throughout salvation history God has revealed not only Himself through the



prophets and world events but also His commands and teachings on how we are to live in relationship with Him and with one another. Again and again God has made covenants with man – always kept faithfully by God but not at all on man's part. The final covenant with humanity has been made through Jesus Christ, the Messiah and Saviour of the world and through His Church He established to exist until the end of time. Throughout the Church's history has come revelations of God to peoples living in various times but none so plentiful as in the last two centuries when God has chosen to send Our Blessed Lady to simple, every day and often poor people, some of them children. In the case of Fatima, Our Lady appeared to three poor shepherd children in Fatima, Portugal on May 13, 1917. The three little children were Lúcia Santos and her cousins Jacinta and Francisco Marto.



The children said they saw a woman "brighter than the sun, shedding rays of light clearer and stronger than a crystal goblet filled with the most sparkling water and pierced by the burning rays of the sun." The

woman wore a white mantle edged with gold and held a rosary in her hand. She asked them to devote themselves to the Holy Trinity and to pray "the Rosary every day, to bring peace to the world and an end to the war". While the children had never told anyone about seeing the angel, Jacinta told her family about seeing the brightly lit woman. Lúcia had earlier said that the three should keep this experience private but Jacinta's disbelieving mother told neighbours about it as a joke, and within a day the whole village knew of the children's vision. However, this appearance would only be the first of six appearances to the children, revealing many things to them but also some secrets that were only many decades later revealed. The culmination of the appearances of Our Lady were seen in The Miracle of the Sun when hundreds of disbelieving people had gathered in the pouring rain around the children who were expecting a sign from Mary. The miracle seen by all would lead to a great outpouring of faith evidenced there and around the world to this day. I will write more about this in the coming year as there is so much to say about God's message to us through Mary. (Fr. Charles)

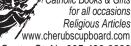
