LOCAL HOSPITALS AND EMERGENCY PASTORAL VISITATION

If you or someone in your family is in the Oshawa, Whitby or Port Perry Hospitals and would like to have a priest (for serious reasons) visit the person who is sick for Anointing of the Sick, Last Rites, Confession or Communion, please note that there is a full-time Catholic Priest assigned to these three hospitals at various times of the week. Simply ask hospital staff to inquire as to whether *Father Pius Alejo* is present in the hospital (or when he will be). If Father Pius Alejo is not available and there is an emergency requiring a Catholic priest, please call St. Leo the Great Parish at 905-655-3286 and when prompted, press "8" and leave your message. Fr. Charles will receive your message (if he is available) and return your call. If there is no emergency but you would like to speak to Fr. Charles, please call the parish office and leave a message with the parish secretary at 905-655-3286 x 101.

THANK YOU FOR THE MUSIC!



It is unhappy news for us as a parish as I announce to parishioners that Bill and Kay Targett, who have served in the music ministry at the 11 am. Sunday Mass here for several years, are retiring with plans to enjoy much together time

warmer climates and with their family. Bill has been the Music Director at the 11 am. Mass for several years now both directing the choir while providing the accompaniment from the organ and keyboard - not an easy feat. Kay has served so faithfully with Bill as cantor from time to time and organizer of music. etc.

[You will notice the steam tractor pictured above. I was looking for a picture of Bill to attach to this article however, the only pictures that came up on a Google search was from an annual steam show held in the UK each year, called the Bill Targett Memorial Steam Rally.]

A number of years ago, following a transitions in the 11 o'clock music leaders in our parish, Bill and Kay Targett were seen by me in the congregation Sunday after Sunday. I had known them from two decades before when I was stationed as Associate Pastor at St. Patrick's Parish in Markham and Bill was the Choir Director. I had also been invited by that choir 10 years ago to accompany them to the Holy Land as they sang in the various Christian sites and churches in the land where Our Lord's feet had walked and His truth still resounds in the power of His real and everlasting presence. Their singing in those places sacred to Christians was nothing less than angelic and of divinity and I was privileged to preside at the Masses each day as we visited the shrines, churches and holy places where Christianity began in the Church founded by Christ.

I also remember well when I was stationed in the small parish of Sacred Heart in Port McNicoll and Bill and Kay brought the choir up to our church singing at the Sunday Mass and filling that small town, it seemed, with joyous music. They held their choir barbecue there and it was an awesome day for both me and the parishioners.

So, back to how Bill Targett got started as our choir director.... At the time we had an accomplished and gifted organist, Trude Olford, as organist at the 11 am. Mass, a woman Bill had known for many years through her involvement in the music ministry at St. Patrick's, Markham. I approached Bill and Kay and asked them if they would be interested in getting involved with our choir. Bill was interested, particularly since having a most competent organist already would allow him to serve as directing the choir. And so it was agreed upon that Bill would serve as Music Director here at St. Leo the Great and thus began a great relationship with our choir members and their new director.

Bill's life experience has been broad and one that has revealed his many gifts and personal integrity. He was a teacher, a principal and served as organist in several parishes throughout the Archdiocese spanning many years. He taught at the famous St. Michael Choir School in Toronto and was choir director at St. Patrick's Parish in Markham for 25 years.

What Bill has done each week in preparation for Mass is truly astonishing, complex and detailed. While we might see his presence and activity as playing a musical instrument for an hour during Mass is in actuality begun long before. chooses the music to coincide with the readings and the themes of the liturgical year and seasons and this, Bill has done so very well. Each week as the presider and homilist I hear Bill's hymn choices so beautifully echo the words of the readings which further proclaims the Gospel message. Then comes the weekly rehearsal with our parish choir members who faithfully, under Bill's direction, learn and sing the various hymns for the upcoming Sunday and season. commitment of both Bill and Kay Targett to this parish for so many years has left a great impact on our spiritual lives and has served to offer us weekly inspiration to both the choir members and the parishioners at large. They will be missed.

A coffee and cake reception will take place in the parish hall following the 11 o'clock Mass this Sunday (Jan. 29) to show our parish appreciation for Bill and Kay's tremendous musical presence here at St. Leo the Great over the past years.

Mr. Ted Schuck, who was St. Michael Choir School trained, aside his two older brothers, has been assisting with parish music over the past year and will become the new Choir Director for the 11 am. Mass. Ted is a school teacher, a husband and father of 3 children, lives here in Brooklin and brings with him decades of parish based music ministry.


