LOCAL HOSPITALS AND EMERGENCY PASTORAL VISITATION

If you or someone in your family is in the Oshawa, Whitby or Port Perry Hospitals and would like to have a priest (for serious reasons) visit the person who is sick for Anointing of the Sick, Last Rites, Confession or Communion, please note that there is a full-time Catholic Priest assigned to these three hospitals at various times of the week. Simply ask hospital staff to inquire as to whether *Father Pius Alejo* is present in the hospital (or when he will be). If Father Pius Alejo is not available and there is an emergency requiring a Catholic priest, please call St. Leo the Great Parish at 905-655-3286 and when prompted, press "8" and leave your message. Fr. Charles will receive your message (if he is available) and return your call. If there is no emergency but you would like to speak to Fr. Charles, please call the parish office and leave a message with the parish secretary at 905-655-3286 x 101.

What is **Totus Tuus?**

Six years ago the Vocations Office of the Archdiocese of Toronto adopted a program found in the U.S. called *Totus Tuus*, named so in honour of the motto of St. John Paul II which means, "Totally Yours". Because our Catholic faith is so rich, meaningful and essential to living to the full in response to Christ's revelation, the weeklong program was designed to teach children from Grades 1 to 6 level, in a 5-day program, the fundamentals of practical Catholic faith. The program also offers a 5-evening component for older youth from Grades 7 to 12 that is geared to their lives and ways of learning and expressing their faith.

I would sum up Totus Tuus as "an experience" because it is anything but boring or learning in a classroom style of teaching. The children - even on the first day - learn songs they will sing at the daily Mass held each day of the camp and parents will often say that their child "came home singing" from the days events. There is much joy and laughter seen and heard in the children as they participate in games, in prayer and in song, as well as a time each day to go outside and run around having fun.

If you know of anyone who would like to experience Totus Tuus for five days this summer, go online to our parish website www.stleothegreat.ca and download the registration form. Fill it out and drop it off at the parish office during business hours or in the mailbox outside the office.

The evening program for the Gr. 7-12 youth runs from

Sunday July 17 to Thursday July 21

and the children's day program for $\underline{Gr. 1-6}$ runs from

Monday July 18 to Friday July 22.

"Some Good Questions"

Last week's bulletin had two articles: the first addressed the question about why we say Jesus rose "again", examining what this means and also why the scriptures say that Mary gave birth to her "firstborn Son". Does "Firstborn" suggest she had other children after Jesus? I also wrote a brief article called "Life: Human vs Gorilla" where I reflected on the incident in the Cincinnati zoo of a 4-year-old boy climbing over a barrier and falling into the gorilla enclosure. I discussed the evident loss of a sense of the life of a human being over that of an animal.

Over the past seven years I have either written my own bulletin articles or have posted what I would consider good, solid Catholic teaching based on the writings of contemporary thinkers on a vast assortment of topics, issues and stories. It's not always easy to know what our parishioners are thinking and this is a quiet parish in the sense that I don't receive a great deal of negative or positive feedback on my writings. Just when I think the time has come for me to cease posting or composing bulletin articles, along comes a parishioner or sometimes even a visitor to our parish who tells me that they read my bulletin articles each week or download it off of our website, and then I get to wondering whether it is serving a useful purpose and worth the time it takes to put it together each week for the Wednesday noon deadline.

Just last weekend, an elderly gentleman whom I know well stopped as he was going into the church to tell me he loves my bulletin articles, and then added, "especially the ones about dogs". I'd have to admit that I've often written about my own dogs or submitted articles about their passing or poems about the dog that brings a tear of emotion in the eyes of those who have known, loved and lost a dog or pet. (When it comes to writing articles about dogs, perhaps I should have been a Vet and not a priest! ③)


