## LOCAL HOSPITALS AND EMERGENCY PASTORAL VISITATION

If you or someone in your family is in the Oshawa, Whitby or Port Perry Hospitals and would like to have a priest (for serious reasons) visit the person who is sick for Anointing of the Sick, Last Rites, Confession or Communion, please note that there is a full-time Catholic Priest assigned to these three hospitals at various times of the week. Simply ask hospital staff to inquire as to whether *Father Pius Alejo* is present in the hospital (or when he will be). If Father Pius Alejo is not available and there is an emergency requiring a Catholic priest, please call St. Leo the Great Parish at 905-655-3286 and when prompted, press "8" and leave your message. Fr. Charles will receive your message (if he is available) and return your call. If there is no emergency but you would like to speak to Fr. Charles, please call the parish office and leave a message with the parish secretary at 905-655-3286 x 101.

## **PRE-AUTHORIZED GIVING**

Our parishioners are most generous in their participation in the life of this parish and many regularly and faithfully give to the Sunday offering using cash, envelopes or through Pre-Authorized Giving. Currently, 122 families and individuals give through PAG which accounts for \$10,450. each month.

Last weekend a presentation was given at all Masses both by me and Nerissa, a representative of the Development Office of the Archdiocese of Toronto. Some parishioners later commented that they couldn't properly hear or understand Nerissa when she spoke. I thought I would recap the overall reason for our Pre-Authorized Giving (PAG) program.

#### PARISH REQUIRES A FIXED INCOME

Our parish requires a fixed amount of money just to cover the weekly/monthly bills which include hydro, water, gas, phone, payroll, maintenance repairs, etc.

Last year, for example, our insurance company did an inspection of our property and while our church is fairly new they found that much of our concrete sidewalks around the church and from the street were heaved from extreme temperatures and created a tripping hazard. The cost of repair was \$33,000. (or roughly 5 ½ weekly collections). All parishes pay 15% of their weekly collection to the Archdiocese of Toronto which enables the Archdiocesan offices, departments and ministries to operate.

The bottom line is that we need a fixed income each week/month to meet our expenses and the best way to do this is by parishioners switching to Pre-Authorized Giving. This means that by the amount you choose to give to the parish each week your bank account will automatically be debited once per month. Many of us already pay our bills through this method and it saves envelopes, cheque writing or the need to have cash.

#### THE NECESSITY AND BENEFITS OF PAG

Every plea for our money comes with good, solid reasons for why we should give. Frankly, outside of our meeting of our own living expenses our God and the physical home for our faith – our parish church - should be reason enough to give and to give generously. As pastor, I contribute both to the financial support of our parish through PAG and have been doing so for a number of years. It is so easy and I don't even have to think about it – the parish receives each month the money I chose to give and I help provide for the parish's expenses and costs to run.

As was pointed out by Nerissa last weekend, with parishioners being away for holidays and throughout the summer weekends the parish income goes up and down, but unfortunately mostly down and the parish never makes up for that shortfall in contributions.

#### **RESPONSE TO CONCERNS**

Some people may be concerned that if they contribute their offertory collection through PAG that they won't then have anything to place in the collection basket each Sunday which may look like they aren't giving at all. A simple solution to this is to obtain a regular box of envelopes (a dummy box) on which you would simply write "PAG" each week and place it in the collection basket. It will simply be collected and the envelope number would be ignored as your real envelope number would be the one associated with your PAG. Also, parishioners may increase, decrease or stop their PAG giving at any time in a simple, immediate way by contacting the parish office.

Switching to PAG is easy and over 150 parishes of the 225 parishes throughout the Archdiocese offer this form of giving to parishioners.

#### SIMPLE STEPS TO SWITCHING TO PAG

- take and read the PAG form
- Pray over and determine how much you think you should give to the parish each week, based on your monthly overall contribution (see the chart)
- Complete the form including your bank info.
- Place the form in a sealed envelope and place it in the collection basket at Mass or drop it off at the parish office
- You're done! It's as easy as that.

Frankly speaking and according to studies, Catholics in general don't give to their parishes what they would give in tips in a week. Looking to our God who has blessed us with every good gift, everything we have and are, the Gospel and indeed the entire biblical reality compels us to give back to God for all God has given us and does for us, His beloved children.

I ask all of our parishioners to consider prayerfully what you are giving to Christ's parish of St. Leo the Great each week and discern what would be an affordable but sacrificial offering which would see our parish meeting its financial demands toward our future, growth and renewal. May the Holy Spirit calls us all to renewal of mind and heart as we grow and live out our lives in the love of Jesus. *(Fr. Charles)*
