### **SOME GOOD QUESTIONS**

There are many questions we Catholics have over the things we say in our creeds and in what we pray in the Mass. Some of these we get to pondering and perhaps even wonder whether we are the only ones who don't know the answer to the baffling query we have about an article of faith or a statement expressive of our belief. The following are two questions I have heard people asking.

#### Why do we say in the Creed that Jesus "rose again from the dead..."? Doesn't the word "again" suggest that He rose before?

This is a very good question and not only well worth asking but also worth knowing about.

In English, the word 'again' often means a repeat of a previously committed act, something we've done repeatedly. If I say that I have been to the fair last night and I intend to "go back again" tonight, the 'again' refers to a repeat of what I did yesterday. But Jesus didn't rise before or at any earlier time, so why use the word 'again' instead of just saying, "On the third day He rose..."?

If you remember the one hit wonder from the band Chumbawamba from a few decades ago Tubthumping, you might remember the following lyrics,

"I get knocked down but I get up again... You are never going to keep me down".

The word 'again found in the song doesn't necessarily suggest that the singer has been knocked down before, in fact, the 'again' could refer to the man returning to the state he was in before he got knocked down. 'He would only need to have been knocked down once to be able to still use the word 'again'. In the same way, Jesus didn't rise at previous times but the 'again' clearly refers to His return to the way He was before He was crucified. He was alive, then dead, and rose from the dead and is alive 'again'. So, Jesus rose again in return to His previous state of being.

Another good question is

If the Catholic Church holds that Mary, the Mother of Jesus, had no other children and, therefore, remained a Virgin, how come scripture says that "she gave birth to her first-born son"?

Again, in our use of the English language, we might assume that the word 'first' automatically means that there may have been other subsequent children, but this is not always When we used the word 'first' to refer to First Communion, for example, it implies that the first Communion of a child or adult will be followed by a life-long

series of receiving Communion, (which, sadly, isn't always the case). But the word 'first' when taken in the opposite direction can also refer not to things that have followed by things that have come before and therefore to the fact that Mary had never given birth to a child before she conceived and gave birth to the Son of God, Jesus.

Obviously, when we put together the scriptures of the Old Testament which speak of the coming Son of Man, the Suffering Servant, the Messiah, they all refer to God's plan of saving His people, ultimately by sending His own Son into the world as Messiah and Saviour. Mary conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit - an extraordinary event that had never come before or since to any woman of the earth, but was first conceived in her mother's womb free from the stain of sin. Therefore, no one could ever hold that Jesus was conceived like all humans and therefore knew sin. His Blessed Mother was protected by God's design and will from having or knowing sin so that her Son would be brought into the world the pure and clean vessel that He was, for He is "God from God".

Also, if Mary had other children after she gave birth to Jesus, then why was she not commended to them by Jesus from the Cross? Instead, He said to John: "Behold your Mother". And the scripture records that from that day on Mary lived with John the disciple of Jesus.

So, 'first-born' refers to Mary never having had a child before Jesus and the Church holds, and with good and sound reason, that she never had any others after Jesus. (Fr. Charles)

#### LIFE: HUMAN vs GORILLA



I'm sure everyone has heard by now of the tragic incident that took place at the Cincinnati Zoo over a week ago. A four-year-old boy managed to climb over a safety barrier and fell 14 feet into the Gorilla enclosure which is surrounded by a shallow moat of water. A 17-year-old male Silverback gorilla named Harambe heard the screams of the people who had saw what had happened which alerted him to the presence of the boy in the moat. The 450 pound gorilla went down to investigate and went to the boy. At times Harambe seemed to be protecting the young child but a few times he rapidly dragged him by the ankle through the water. The gorilla was clearly agitated and disturbed by all the screaming and the strange horrified boy in his enclosure. The ordeal of the gorilla with the boy went on for 10-minutes until the zoo officials agreed that this was a seriously dangerous situation for the safety of the boy and decided they would have to shoot and kill the gorilla, which they did.

Granted, Harambe was the victim of a situation of a human invading his space and he died for it. On the endangered species list, the loss of the animal was a huge blow to the zoo but, as the director of the zoo said, "We had to shoot the gorilla to save the little boy".

Of course there is loads of controversy and finger-pointing going on with people blaming the zoo, the parents of the boy or somehow suggesting that the gorilla should have just been tranquilized instead of being shot dead. Many people have suggested that the gorilla should have been saved at all costs presuming that the boy would have survived the ordeal, a big presumption indeed.

It seems to me that what should be paramount in this sad story is that the boy is alive and largely unharmed from his ordeal. It's a very dangerous trip to be taking when we are ready to suggest that the animal and his survival is somehow equal or even close-to-equal to the life of the four-year-old boy, or perhaps even greater — which is perhaps shocking but not surprising given that the sanctity of human life has suffered a consistent downturn in the past half-century, particularly in the last decade or so. The zoo, whose very existence is all about the care of endangered and wild animals for the viewing and education of humans, clearly has sided with human life as their top priority, which should never ever be called into question in a situation like this, but has been. "We did the right thing", said zoo director "...and we would do it again".

Nothing on the face of the earth can or ever should trump the life of a human being, for we have been created "a little lower than the Angels and have been put in charge of all creation". (Psalm 8:5, Hebrews 2:7) Man might not always live up to the dignity of his being created and may even be seen at times to act and live in a way that is far beneath that dignity due to sin, but it is his call, invitation and expectation that he will seek to live according to his making by the Maker of all — our God!
