### LOCAL HOSPITALS AND EMERGENCY PASTORAL VISITATION

If you or someone in your family is in the Oshawa, Whitby or Port Perry Hospitals and would like to have a priest (for serious reasons) visit the person who is sick for Anointing of the Sick, Last Rites, Confession or Communion, please note that there is a full-time Catholic Priest assigned to these three hospitals at various times of the week. Simply ask hospital staff to inquire as to whether *Father Pius Alejo* is present in the hospital (or when he will be). If Father Pius Alejo is not available and there is an emergency requiring a Catholic priest, please call St. Leo the Great Parish at 905-655-3286 and when prompted, press "8" and leave your message. Fr. Charles will receive your message (if he is available) and return your call. If there is no emergency but you would like to speak to Fr. Charles, please call the parish office and leave a message with the parish secretary at 905-655-3286 x 101.

### A NEW START IN LENT – IN LIFE FOLLOWING BISHOP RIESBECK'S TALK

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This past Wednesday evening we were pleased to have had Ottawa Auxiliary Bishop Christian Riesbeck with us as he gave a Lenten talk to our gathered parishioners. At the end of his message the Bishop distributed copies of and we projected on the sanctuary walls a Prayer of Commitment/Surrender to the Lord. Bishop Riesbeck is a member of the religious order of the Companions of the Cross and this prayer was written by their founder, the late Father Bob Bedard.

The prayer is a straight forward but powerful giving of one's self to the Lord much along the lines of people who have given their lives over to the will and care of God for centuries. This kind of prayer is meant to follow a soulstirring Gospel message of Jesus' great love and His will that the sinner not die but live and invite the Lord to be Lord of his or her life. When one is open to the invitation of God to come to Him, then the Holy Spirit so beautifully moves in us toward God, even and especially for those who may have been living anything but a God-centered life. God is faithful and when we make a commitment from the heart to follow Him and to surrender our lives to Him, He accepts that surrender we offer and a new form of close relationship begins in our lives and living.

This prayer reflects the very spirit of Lent which calls us to turn inward and examine our lives. Are we following Jesus or the world? Are we living with burdens of sin that are weighing us down and keeping us from a freeing relationship with Jesus? Have we experienced the grace of making a good confession, after first properly reviewing our conscience with an Examination of Conscience, and known the beautiful grace of the forgiveness of our sins by Jesus' great love and mercy?

The human condition finds us trying to take advantage of a new start in our lives, most often at the beginning of a new calendar year. We make resolutions to lose weight, eat better, exercise more and a plethora of other possible decisions to in some way change our poor or bad habits. Lent affords the Christian heart the season-long opportunity to approach the changing of our lives or the reorientation of our lives back toward Jesus. Because Jesus longs to be personal to us, we are accepting what He has always been waiting to give us in His love, mercy and grace. He wants to walk with us every step of this life journey and as we walk with Him His presence changes us, summons us on to closer union with Him. The unhealthy, ungodly habits we have formed over time will start to fall away as our relationship with Him deepens. Only Jesus can give us a joy that no one or nothing can take away from us as long as we are united with Him in our daily giving of our lives to Him. We can't outdo Jesus in generosity. Any part of us we surrender to Him receives revival and renewal. On our own it is difficult to follow God just as it would be difficult to adhere to a collection of laws to govern our behavior. Jesus has written His law on our hearts and not on paper so that they are living laws which will bring about a new, free and gracefilled way of living in us.

Father Bob's Prayer of Commitment/Surrender is such a moving speaking of the heart to God as it acknowledges our human weakness before the power of Jesus. It brings us to Jesus by way of His Cross, (prominently visible on our church sanctuary wall) which has saved us. We see in His body hanging on the cross not defeat but tremendous love which goes to death for you and me. And yet that death and our death to sin leads to Resurrection power and life which will enable us to live as never before, like a true disciple, servant and follower of the Greatest Love, Our Lord Jesus Christ!

I have published this commitment prayer here so that even if you were unable to attend the Lenten evening retreat this past week, you may be able to make and take some quiet time and prayerfully ask Jesus to come to you, speak to you, accept you in this beautiful prayer of commitment as you accept Him as your Lord, your Saviour, your all.

# Prayer of Commitment/Surrender to the Lord (Fr. Robert Bedard, CC)

Father, I place myself in your presence now as I make this commitment that I believe your Son, Jesus, is calling me to make. Send your Holy Spirit upon me to help me to pray.

I worship you as Creator, God of heaven and earth, and I want to give you all the praise you expect from me.

My Lord Jesus, I want to follow your call. You have accomplished my salvation, and that of all the world, upon the Cross by the shedding of your blood. I accept that salvation.

You have died to take away the sins of the world. On the Cross, you bore all of my sins, and your forgiveness is available to me. I confess my sinfulness. I claim that forgiveness, and I forgive all those who have ever offended me.

Jesus, it was out of love for all of us that you gave up your life. And you would have given it up out of love for me alone. I now accept that love.

I want you to be the Lord of my life in every possible way. I give you my understanding, my will, my spirit, my physical being, my possessions, my desires, my plans. I want to surrender to you completely. I desire a personal relationship with you as my Lord and Saviour. I give you my cares, my worries, my fears, my hangups, all my difficulties, and I ask you to set me free.

Father, my faith is weak. I want to believe but doubts cause me to hesitate. Grant me, I pray, through Jesus, your Son, the gift of divine faith. Sweep away all my doubts and give me that assurance that only your gift of faith can impart.

Father, your Son, Jesus, said that if we asked you anything in his name, you would faithfully grant it. I ask you now in Jesus' name to answer my prayer.

May all glory, all praise be to you, Father, all worship and honour, homage and blessing, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit, reigning with you, one God, now and forever. AMEN.
