YOUTH MINISTRY IN OUR PARISH What is N.E.T.? & What is iNFUSE?

"Evangelizing is in fact the grace and vocation proper to the Church, her deepest identity. She exists to evangelize" (Pope Paul VI). NET (National Evangelization Teams) exists to fulfil this mission.

NET Ministries of Canada, established in 1994, began with a travelling retreat team consisting of young adult volunteer missionaries. To this day our Encounter Teams (travelling teams) go from town to town proclaiming the Gospel of Christ to over 25,000 young people in schools and parishes. In every retreat young people encounter Jesus in a new and personal way. After retreats, many parishes look for support to continue helping their young people grow in love for Christ and the Church. Inspired by the Holy Spirit, NET's answer to this question is their iNFUSE (parish-based) teams. The young adults who form the teams are dynamic, fun-loving, joy-filled and exuberant in their Catholic faith.

NET, (National Evangelization Teams), see it as their mission within the Roman Catholic Church to challenge young Catholics to love Christ and embrace the life of the Church. This is accomplished through the work of the NET teams by:

- Proclaiming the Gospel of Christ through a personal witness of faith.
- Inviting young people to live for Christ.
- Forming young people in Christian character through the study and practice of our faith.
- Equipping youth workers and young adults with the ministry skills needed for evangelization.

Our own parish of St. Leo the Great, along with many others throughout the Archdiocese of Toronto and other parishes in dioceses across Canada have experienced NET through Confirmation retreats put on at the local parish level to prepare young people for the Sacrament of the Holy's Spirit's power. Any of our young people who have experienced a NET retreat would tell you that they were touched and moved by the genuine love and faith witness of the young adult team that came to their parish. They are authentic in their love for Christ and others and show it in the way they speak, act, sing and share the love of Jesus with others. Our young people are moved by the fact that the NET team is comprised of young people from provinces across Canada as well as from other countries such as Ireland, New Zealand and England.

Since 1995, NET Canada has facilitated over 5000 retreats in more than 40 different diocese. Through this extensive experience, they have been able to adapt their message to address the most pressing needs of youth today. Because of the various issues in our current youth culture, they have created different retreat themes. These themes, though varied, all have at the heart the message of God's unending love, and how He has come to fulfill their needs through the Church.

Over the course of 10 months, one traveling team on the road will:

- Serve in roughly 17 different diocese
- Travel over 20,000 KM
- Facilitate approximately 125 retreats
- Share the Gospel with over 8,700 youth

Why NET here at St. Leo the Great?

Because most parishes and schools struggle to share the basic Gospel message. NET forms disciples to evangelize youth. Through NET our young people are encountering Christ and engaging in the life of the Church.

With a NET team coming to our parish (God willing) they would bring to our parish what is called "local ministry", which means they would be specifically and exclusively working with St. Leo the Great parish, its parishioners, youth, volunteers and our schools to work toward building a firm foundation on which future youth ministry can grow and even thrive.

The local ministry is a customizable method for implementing youth ministry. One of the most difficult things about a youth ministry program in a parish or school is getting it started. We understand this and we want to help. NET has helped jump-start youth ministry programs in over 30 parishes across Canada since 2001. A NET local team provides a parish with a team of 6 - 8 young adults on fire for Christ who are passionate about bringing the love of Jesus to young people and have gone through five weeks of intensive formation and ministry training. A NET team can give the jump start that a healthy and sustainable youth ministry program needs.

What is iNFUSE?

iNFUSE is a method of youth ministry for a parish, customized to the parish's needs. The goal of iNFUSE is to create a foundation of youth ministry. iNFUSE aims to accomplish this goal through certain objectives and building blocks chosen with the individual parish to best fit the community. One of the most difficult things about a youth ministry program in a parish is getting it started. Since 2001, NET has helped jump-start youth ministry programs in over 29 parishes across Canada and Ireland. An iNFUSE team consists of 6-8 young adults on fire for Christ, having received over 600 hours of formation, and who are passionate about bringing the love of Jesus to young people. An iNFUSE team can lay the foundation that a healthy and sustainable youth ministry needs.

Where We Are At Now

Before a parish can even be considered by NET for a parish team the parish must obtain the permission of the local bishop, which we have asked for and received from Bishop Nguyen, Auxiliary Bishop for the Eastern Pastoral Region of the Archdiocese of Toronto. We also obtained a favourable response from the Director of the Office of Catholic Youth, Fr. Frank Portelli.

We have now submitted our application to get a NET Parish Team to be sent to us and if we are successful we would see seven young men and women arrive in our parish in early October who would work in our parish from week to week, focusing on meeting with and engaging with our young people in both the elementary schools and the high schools of our area.

Where would the team live and work?

The iNFUSE team would work within the parish, using a general space dedicated to them as their office where all seven team members can do their work and preparations. The team would live in the homes of our parishioners, staying at each home willing to host a team of a few guys or a few girls for a two week period. They would live and interact with our parish families and young people in this way and at the end of the two-week period would move on to the next family for another two week period.

What is the cost of a parish team for a year?

The cost is about the same as the annual wages of a full-time youth director, which means our parish costs would remain about the same as they are now but with seven people working to realize youth ministry.
