THE MARCH FOR LIFE 2019



Once again this year I attended the annual National March For Life in Ottawa. Francesco Bianco along with a few other members of the Knights of Columbus organized the coach bus which took the 37 parishioners from our parish (including five of our NET Team members) along with 19 young people from St. Therese Parish the largest Courtice to

gathering on Parliament Hill each year.

Each year this natonal prolife gathering begins with speeches and prayers for and about the unborn and our struggle to gain in public recognition what we know God desires of us – that we must defend the humn right to life of the unborn as well as all life from conception to natural death.

This year we heard an address from the producers of the movie, Gosnell, which has been recently released in the U.S. and will eventually come to Canadian theatres. Dr. Kermit Gosnell was a doctor who performed abortions at his Women's Medical Clinic in Philadelphia. In February of 2010 the FBI raided his clinic in the belief that he was selling illegal drugs, but their investigation took a horrific turn when they discovered a "house of horrors", as they described it. Any description of what the FBI found would not be fitting for the parish bulletin nor for the ears of decent human beings, but suffice it to say that the charges Dr. Gosnell was found guilty of committing - 3 counts of murder and 1 count of involuntary manslaughter - give a good indication of what was found in his abortuary. The courtroom throughout his trial was largely and strangely empty from the usually packed courtrooms by the media in mass-murder cases, but the media didn't report on the Gosnell case, which is all the more reason why the producers of the film felt the need to do so.

A former Director of a Planned Parent clinic in the U.S., Abbey Johnson, also spoke. A recently released movie about her conversion from being pro-abortion to prolife has also been released in the U.S. called *Unplanned*.

There were other people who spoke giving their testimony about seeking an abortion and seeing people praying outside of the abortion clinic they were to enter only to be persuaded by their conscience and the witness of others who supported the right to life of their child, to not go through with it. They had their little boys and little girls and to this day can't believe what they were going to do to them. The March helped us focus on the sanctity of life.

WHY IT'S HARD TO BE PROLIFE

You can be absolutely right about something and not have an easy time about it. On the issue of human life itself, one may know, yes know, that God is the orgin of that life and that to take it is not only murder but an abomination against the gift of life itself. So, it's not a question about whether we should take the prolife stance or not, that's indisputable. What's tough is the fact that abortion is ugly, horrific and messy and it conjures up images of death and so no one wants to hear about it let alone see it. They say that after the Jewish holocaust, many Germans and others around the world denied that it happened. It was only the film footage taken by the U.S. that showed the piled corpses and the half-dead survivors that made people realize it was so horrificly true beyond words. The same has been said about the issue of abortion. As long as it remains only a word, or is masked with terms like 'women's health' and 'women's reproductive rights' as used by politicians and those who are for abortion on demand, we never have to see it or face it or see a dead human when in fact there have been millions - 1 billion, 534 million, 837 thousand, at the time of this writing since 1980. Our God sees what we have done with the lives given to us and the flimsy stances some of us Christians take and the fake assumptions that those who stand for the defense of the life of the unborn don't care about the women or their situations that find them considering abortion in the first place. The Catholic Church has been on the front line of protecting the unborn child as well as offering aid, counselling and real help to the mother when all others only talk about "a women's right to choose" but don't lift a finger to assist them beyond using them for their cause. Even the good causes such as lapel roses and money given to aid women may only be as window dressing when it comes to stopping abortion altogether. The good news is that while the last couple of generations have largely done nothing to put an end to the dirty word 'abortion' this present generation has grown a different mind, realizing that the science is on our side as to when life begins. The rest of us need to, before God, catch up. (FrC)
