LOCAL HOSPITALS AND EMERGENCY PASTORAL VISITATION

If you or someone in your family is in the Oshawa, Whitby or Port Perry Hospitals and would like to have a priest (for serious reasons) visit the person who is sick for Anointing of the Sick, Last Rites, Confession or Communion, please note that there is a full-time Catholic Priest assigned to these three hospitals at various times of the week. Simply ask hospital staff to inquire as to whether *Father Pius Alejo* is present in the hospital (or when he will be). If Father Pius Alejo is not available and there is an emergency requiring a Catholic priest, please call St. Leo the Great Parish at 905-655-3286 and when prompted, press "8" and leave your message. Fr. Charles will receive your message (if he is available) and return your call. If there is no emergency but you would like to speak to Fr. Charles, please call the parish office and leave a message with the parish secretary at 905-655-3286 x 101.

PARISH YOUTH MINISTRY UPDATE

This past Friday, following a week of 'goodbye's' and blessing our dynamic missionaries of Abbra, Will, Chelsey, Faith, Joe and Luke who for the last months were our NET Team, the team loaded up their van and trailer and headed to Ottawa, the headquarters of the National Evangelization Teams, to debrief on their year spent in our parish along with all of the other Road Teams and Parish Teams sent to various parts of the country. They will enjoy a time of retreat and quiet before either continuing to work for NET in some capacity or resuming their former lives of school or work.

Looking back, it is hard to believe that they have been here and are gone already as the time has passed so quickly in their busy schedule of living with our parish families in Host Homes, planning and putting on Alpha, Edge and Impact each week and visiting our elementary and secondary schools on a regular basis. They seemed to always be on the go if not in their office and at their desks planning and preparing for their encounters with our young people.

At the Pot Luck which followed the last Mass the team provided the music for, as they have for the last eight months, it was moving to hear the remarks of the youth in the 'open mic' forum where anyone who wanted to personally thank the NET Team had an opportunity to do so. Several parents and Host Home family members commented on how they loved having the team living with them, but it was the youth who expressed their personal gratitude in having drawn closer to the experience of Christ through the work of our missionary team of six. There were laughs, smiles and tears as we parishioners said our goodbye's to the six young people who stopped in the lives they were living to come to us and share Christ, in their youthfulness and energy, with us.

WHERE WE ARE HEADED NOW

In case our parishioners may have forgotten our plan for youth ministry with the direction and teams from NET Ottawa, we are about to enter into what could be called Phase II in the building of our youth program. Our intention is to lay a firm foundation for youth ministry that will last into the future, meeting the needs of simply yet profoundly, as the NET motto says, "Bringing youth to Christ". Our first NET team did the work of evangelization in meeting and mingling with our youth from grade six to grade twelve and inviting them to come to the weekly youth groups appropriate to their age group. A second team of six or seven will be sent to us on October 1, 2019 to continue this work but to specifically focus on training our youth leaders (parishioners who have shown the gifts and the desire to assist in leadership) as well as those parishioners, both adult and youth, who want to become involved in assisting the work of youth ministry in set up, coordinating, facilitating food, etc. This second NET team will be here for eight months and will complete in this period ending in May 2020 the direct involvement of NET Ministries, the work only NET could have accomplished among us with their youth missionaries who aren't afraid to approach anyone, especially youth, about a relationship with Christ in the life of the Church.

HIRING A FULL-TIME YOUTH MINISTER

Mid-way through Team II's evangelical work with our youth, our parish will hire our Full-Time Youth Director who will work with the NET team for their remaining 5 months in order that a smooth transition of NET to the youth director may take place. The hiring of a youth minister will be done in such a way as to ensure that the same spirit and energy of youth ministry established under the direction of NET will continue. A youth director by themselves could not do the work that a whole team of 'Netters' can do, but with the trained leaders and volunteers who have expressed a heart for our youth, the same evangelization spirit will be visible and continue.

Following a busy year that largely follows the school year, the youth director and team will continue to offer various activities, sessions and social events to bring the youth together while gearing up for the fall when, sometime in September 2020, the various youth groups will resume.

In the end youth ministry is all about Jesus Christ, who gave us the Holy Spirit so that He would not merely be a life to be copied but a veritable life to be lived. We all need Jesus Christ. Our youth desperately need Christ, though in the world they might have no sense of this reality. Our God has so beautifully drawn close to us and will do so as we open our lives to Him. (Fr. 
