#### **Family of Faith Campaign Update**

Campaign Goal – \$390,000. Pledges received (as of Wed. Oct. 28) – \$162,000.

That's **41%** of our goal!

As I announced at all the Masses last weekend, our parish campaign for the *Family of Faith* has begun. The Family of Faith campaign is part of the overall Pastoral Plan for the Archdiocese of Toronto with an overall goal of raising 105 million dollars over a five year giving period through all of its 225 parishes. The campaign begun two years ago is now in its final wave (Wave 4) and being held in 49 parishes, St. Leo the Great being one of them.

Each parish was assigned a proportionate goal and our goal is \$390,000. Since the campaign in every parish covers a five year giving period, parishioners are asked to make a pledge of payments on a monthly, bi-annually or yearly basis over the five years and can be made by cheque, credit card or automatic debt.

While half of the money raised will go toward the more immediate needs of the restoration of St. Michael's Cathedral, the building of new parishes and the refurbishing of older ones, the remaining half of the campaign money will provide University and College chaplaincies, assist parishes in hiring Youth Ministers, establish evangelization and adult faith formation programs throughout the Archdiocese.

#### MY PERSONAL COMMITMENT

As pastor, I feel I should qualify my own participation in this campaign - I have committed a total pledge of \$6,000. which works out to \$100. per month at \$1200. per year over a five year period.

Just as our parishioners are being asked to participate in this campaign even while they may also have other charitable commitments, I also regularly contribute to the parish Offertory collection (PAG), sponsor a seminarian in India, a child in Chile (through Chalice) and contribute on a monthly basis to Sick Children's Hospital.

#### **OUR PARISH COMMITMENT**

As a parish, all of our parishioners will be contacted through this campaign, will be given information and background about the great needs which exist and how individuals and families may contribute and participate. Our parish too is a family of faith — the Christian faith of the ages which binds us together universally and locally. God bless our efforts!



### PRO-CHOICE STUDENTS RETHINK ABORTION AFTER STUDYING CHICKEN EMBRYOS

I found the following article to be quite interesting in that it shows how human experience can lead to a change of mind. I have always been pro-life (as is Christ, the Author of all life) and somewhat active through pro-life activities such as Life Chain and the March For Life in Ottawa. There has been very little debate on the issue of abortion, in my opinion, since there is rarely any calm conversation about this heated issue, especially between the pro-life people and the pro-abortion side. In my personal experience the proabortion side rarely debates or argues - they just seek to shut you up and always resort to name calling. Walking with my Roman collar on at the March For Life in Ottawa alongside 25,000 others, the pro-abortion people, usually numbering about 50 people or so, will personally call out at me and other priests as we silently walk along, with things I might find on a public washroom wall and certainly not fit to print in a parish bulletin.

Yet, if people could just stop talking and do the research and the reading they would find that the great mystery of life itself, found in all living things, is evidence of a wonderfully creative and creating God who has designed all things with such intricate detail and profound beauty. Like the students in the article which follows, their stance on abortion changed a great deal when they actually looked at the miracle of life and development of a chicken embryo when observed under a microscope and applied that to human life. Former abortionist Dr. Bernard Nathanson was pivotal in legalizing abortion in New York before *Roe v. Wade.* After he became pro-life, <u>he said</u>, "Fewer women would have abortions if wombs had windows."

Nathanson's own pro-life conversion came after he observed preborn babies on ultrasound, which was a new technology at that time. He believed that because preborn babies went unseen, it was easy to dismiss their suffering and death in abortion. Because the babies are hidden, they often were (and still are) disregarded by abortion supporters, who focus exclusively on the women they think abortion helps (despite numerous studies showing that abortion is detrimental to women's mental health). Nathanson believed that if people could see preborn babies nestled in their mother's wombs, many would find abortion unthinkable.

When something happens to open a pro-abortion person's eyes to the reality of what goes on inside a woman's womb, it sometimes brings conversion. This is why many women who are considering abortion <u>change their minds</u> <u>when they see their babies</u> on an ultrasound screen.

In the following account, some pro-abortion students had their beliefs challenged in a biology class.

Ted Merrill, who has performed some abortions himself, wrote about how students in one of his classes started to rethink their views on abortion after they studied chicken embryos:

Extreme positions may be easier when the argument is intellectual. But they don't hold up at close range. I noticed this in my interactions with college students in an anatomy and physiology class I taught. The nine students in this all-female class were unequivocally in favor of abortion rights when we started the section on reproduction. But something changed when they studied live chick embryos.

I had explained to them that all vertebrates closely resemble one another during early development. Then we open fertilized eggs at various stages. Under a microscope, eggs that have incubated for 36 hours show the first rudiments of an embryo, and a crude tubular structure rhythmically twitching in the center. At 48 hours, you can see an elementary – but definitely formed – heart pumping red blood cells through a looped network of tubes. You can recognize an eye. Just a day later, there are limbs, a face, and a brain that looks like linked sausages.

As the young women looked at these early-stage embryos and watched that amazing little heart beating, they were moved. "If we closed up the shell and put it back in the incubator, would it still grow?" one of them asked me. Another said, "It's going to die in a little while under the microscope, isn't it?" A third student declared, "I don't think we should be doing this." And while some of my students couldn't wait to see how the embryo progressed through the later stages of development, others became upset and refused to open any more eggs.

When I brought the talk around to abortion again, I noticed that their feelings were no longer clear-cut. They all upheld a woman's right to choose, but felt that other factors had to be considered, too.

While none of the pro-abortion students went so far as to embrace the pro-life position, they were made very uneasy by seeing the reality of developing life — even though it was not human life. Their "pro-choice" views had been based on slogans and sound bites; they had never really considered what it is that abortion destroys. Seeing the chicken embryos and their beating hearts was enough to challenge their views.

It is striking how a little bit of reality, even when that reality concerns animals, could cause strongly proabortion students to reconsider their positions.
