The parishioners are invited for Coffee Sunday this week, Nov 27th, after the 9a.m and the 11 a.m. mass, organized by CWL.



#### **Welcoming the season of Advent...**

We are approaching the season of advent. The word 'advent' means 'coming' or 'arrival. The season of Advent is a time for preparation. Based on experience, we have an intuitive understanding of Advent. We usually consider Advent as in preparation for Christmas, the First Coming of Christ. Yet the season of Advent is not just for wrapping gifts and holiday decorations. In addition to that, we should also think about it, in connection with the second coming of Christ.

According to the General Norms for the Liturgical Year and the Calendar: Advent has a twofold character: as a season to prepare for Christmas when Christ's first coming to us is remembered; as a season when that remembrance directs the mind and heart to await Christ's Second Coming at the end of time. Advent is thus a period for devout and joyful expectation [Norms 39].

As a season reminding the two comings of Christ, we should celebrate the season more spiritually. It is a time when we join our present-day longings with the longings of the Chosen People. In our present scenario, we also long to be saved from the restraints that keep us away from catholic life.



The Advent season takes place over four weeks. Commonly, each of the four weeks of Advent contains a special theme: hope, peace, love, and joy. The purpose of each theme is to spend time reflecting on the true meaning of the season - the life of Jesus Christ. Each of these themes represents the God's gifts that should be shared with mankind. During the advent season, through meditations and prayers, we should contemplate ways to share these deepest gifts.


As we are entering to the first week themed hope, we would be owning a biblical hope, that chooses to wait expectantly for God to bring his goodness to our lives, no matter how dark our circumstances are. For us

Catholics, it is the faith that unveils hope. Faith and hope are overlapping realities. So, do not be worried about the circumstances that confront us, look up to God, remember his promises, fill our heart with faith and ultimately with hope in God. "The people walking in darkness have seen a great light; on those living in the land of deep darkness, a light has dawned. (Isaiah 9:2,6-7)".

Over this Advent, let hope would rise in our spirits to enlighten us to lead a life filled with joy in Christ.

#### The Man Behind the Story of Santa Claus

St. Nicholas was a Bishop who lived in the fourth century, in a place called Myra in Asia Minor (now called Turkey). He was a very rich man because his parents died when he was young and left him a lot of money. He was also a very kind man and had a reputation for helping the poor and giving secret gifts to



people who needed it. There are several legends about St. Nicholas, although we don't know if any of them are true!

The most famous story about St. Nicholas tells how the custom of hanging up stockings to put presents in first started! It goes like this:

There was a poor man who had three daughters. The man was so poor that he did not have enough money for a dowry, so his daughters couldn't get married. One night, Nicholas secretly dropped a bag of gold down the chimney and into the house (this meant that the oldest daughter was then able to be married). The bag fell into a stocking that had been hung by the fire to dry! This was repeated later with the second daughter. Finally, determined to discover the person who had given him the money, the father secretly hid by the fire every evening until he caught Nicholas dropping in a bag of gold. Nicholas begged the man to not tell anyone what he had done, because he did not want to bring attention to himself. But soon the news got out and when anyone received a secret gift, it was thought that maybe it was from Nicholas.

Because of his kindness Nicholas was made a Saint. His feast day is celebrated on the anniversary of his death, December 6.


