
RCIA: Catechesis to Enter into Full Communion in the Catholic Church

Season of Creation – September 1 – October 4, 2023

The Season of Creation begins September 1 with the World Day of Prayer for the Care of Creation and runs through October 4, the feast of St. Francis of Assisi. This year's theme is: "Let Justice and Peace Flow".

In the words of Pope Francis, this season offers "individual believers and communities a fitting opportunity to reaffirm their personal vocation to be stewards of creation, to thank God for the wonderful handiwork which he has entrusted to our care, and to implore his help for the protection of creation as well as his pardon for the sins committed against the world in which we live."

In late August, Pope Francis announced that the second part of his encyclical, Laudato Si' will be published on October 4, 2023. In the Holy Father's message for the World Day of Prayer for the Care of Creation, Pope Francis recalls his 2022 penitential pilgrimage to Canada:

"On a beautiful summer day in July 2022, during my pilgrimage to Canada, I reflected on this (Let Justice and Peace Flow) on the shores of Lac Ste. Anne in Alberta. That lake has been a place of pilgrimage for many generations of indigenous people. Surrounded by the beating of drums, I thought: "How many hearts have come here with anxious longing, weighed down by life's burdens, and found by these waters consolation and strength to carry on! Here, immersed in creation, we can also sense another beating: the maternal heartbeat of the earth. Just as the hearts of babies in the womb beat in harmony with those of their mothers, so in order to grow as people, we need to harmonize our own rhythms of life with those of creation, which gives us life".

During this Season of Creation, let us dwell on those heartbeats: our own and those of our mothers and grandmothers, the heartbeat of creation and the heartbeat of God. Today they do not beat in harmony; they are not harmonized in justice and peace. Too many of our brothers and sisters are prevented from drinking from that mighty river. Let us heed our call to stand with the victims of environmental and climate injustice, and to put an end to the senseless war against creation."

Sister of Life to Profess Final Vows in Toronto

A Sister of Life will profess her final vows at St. Michael's Cathedral Basilica this Saturday, August 26. Archbishop Francis Leo will be the main celebrant and homilist.

Sr. Gaudia Maria Magdalena was raised in the Archdiocese of Ottawa and attended St. Hyacinth Parish/Parafia Św. Jacka. She graduated from the University of Ottawa with a Bachelor's Degree in Health Sciences. Prior to entering the Sisters of Life, Sr. Gaudia Maria Magdalena completed the Social Service Worker Program at Algonquin College and spent a year of Faith Formation at St. Therese School in Bruno, Saskatchewan.

Sr. Gaudia spent her first two years as a professed sister on the Postulant Formation Team in the Bronx (2018-2020). In 2020, she was missioned to Philadelphia to assist in the Visitation Mission to pregnant women. In 2021, she joined the mission in Toronto which includes services to vulnerable, pregnant women, accompaniment on the journey of hope and healing for those suffering after the experience of abortion as well as evangelization.

Sisters take the traditional vows of poverty, chastity and obedience – as well as a fourth vow to protect and enhance the sacredness of human life.

St. Padre Pio Sept. 23

St. Padre Pio (Francesco Forgione) was a priest and friar in the Capuchin order. An Italian, he was beatified and canonized by St. John Paul II and is widely known for various supernatural phenomena such as exhibiting the stigmata, being a catalyst for various miracles, and bilocating.

Padre Pio (1887–1968) is the patron saint of adolescents, stress relief, civil defense volunteers, and January blues. His feast day is Sept. 23.

- St. Padre Pio was known to have stigmata On Sept. 20, 1918. Padre Pio received the stigmata while praying in a church. They remained visible on his body for the rest of his life. The stigmata correspond to the wounds suffered by Jesus during his crucifixion.
- St. Padre Pio's stigmata wounds had a distinct aroma. The blood that came from Padre Pio's wounds is said to have smelled like flowers or perfume, a trait referred to as the "odor of sanctity" that has also been exhibited by other saints who manifested stigmata markings.
- St. Padre Pio saw and spoke with Jesus, Mary, and his guardian angel as a young boy.
- "In his simplicity, Francesco assumed everyone had the same experiences," according to PadrePioDevotions.org.
- St. Padre Pio was religious from a young age. Padre Pio was deeply connected to his faith starting at an early age. At the age of 5, he consecrated himself to Jesus. When he was 10, his family looked to see how he could become a Capuchin friar.
- St. Padre Pio had the gift of bilocation.

There are many eyewitness accounts that claim Padre Pio was able to be in multiple places at once. Some come from his fellow friars who are said to have seen him in prayer outside when they knew he was still in his room. Others come from those who are said to have seen him on different continents the world over. Perhaps the most famous claim is that he appeared in the sky over San Giovanni Rotondo, Italy, during World War II.
