## LOCAL HOSPITALS AND EMERGENCY PASTORAL VISITATION

If you or someone in your family is in the Oshawa, Whitby or Port Perry Hospitals and would like to have a priest (for serious reasons) visit the person who is sick for Anointing of the Sick, Last Rites, Confession or Communion, please note that there is a full-time Catholic Priest assigned to these three hospitals at various times of the week. Simply ask hospital staff to inquire as to whether *Father Pius Alejo* is present in the hospital (or when he will be). If Father Pius Alejo is not available and there is an emergency requiring a Catholic priest, please call St. Leo the Great Parish at 905-655-3286 and when prompted, press "8" and leave your message. Fr. Charles will receive your message (if he is available) and return your call. If there is no emergency but you would like to speak to Fr. Charles, please call the parish office and leave a message with the parish secretary at 905-655-3286 x 101.

# CONFIRMATION (Gr. 7) 2016-2017

Following last year's change throughout the Archdiocese which realized a new grade level for the reception of the Sacrament of Confirmation from grade 8 to now grade 7, our parish wishes to invite our grade 7 children our Catholic and Public schools to the preparation for the sacrament. The Sacrament of Confirmation is the time when Catholics receive the powerful and necessary gifts of the Holy Spirit which enables them to live as true disciples of Jesus Christ. Given the moral climate of the world today and the challenges confronting people of faith, our young people need these gifts, perhaps even and hopefully, one day, earlier than ever before.

Parents with children in Grade 7 (or children in higher grades that may not have already been Confirmed) are asked to attend one of the two offered Parent Information meetings to receive information and register for the Confirmation preparation.

Meeting along with a copy of your child's Baptismal Certificate, the Registration Donation Fee (\$50.) and your child's sponsor form filled out by his or her parish priest and signed by him.

This year we will once again hold 8 preparation classes on 8 consecutive Wednesday's from 7 - 8:30 pm. in the parish hall.

## BETTER UNDERSTANDING MERCY

In this Year of Mercy, so declared by our Holy Father, Pope Francis, it is good for us to continue to ponder just what God's mercy is and means. One place among the many places within the Mass where mercy is mentioned is when we pray for the dead. Have you ever noticed that there are two groups being prayed for in the Eucharistic Prayer? We pray thus:

"Remember also our brothers and sisters who have fallen asleep in the hope of the resurrection, and all who have died in your mercy."

Who are our "brothers and sisters who have fallen asleep"? They are our fellow Christians who have been baptized and died believing in Christ as Saviour. So, then, who are those included in "and all who have died in your mercy"? All other people who may not share our faith. They, like all of us, in fact all people in the world, are in need of God's mercy. Perhaps, unlike us, they were never raised with a sense of the resurrection but in God's wide mercy and full knowledge of them and their hearts, may grant them eternal life with Him because of His great mercy.

The former text stated.... "and all those whose faith is known to you alone". In these words we are commending all the dead to God who, as throughout all of salvation history and most especially in the New Covenant of Jesus Christ, loves all humanity and does not grant us what we deserve for our sins, but in His profound mercy, is able to somehow, according to His divine knowledge, admit us forever into His presence.

This reality of praying for all the dead before God is yet another facet of the fullness of God's great and mysterious mercy.

Recently, I heard an American bishop say in an interview that he has heard many people refer to the greatest attribute of God as His mercy, when in fact, this isn't true and shows a serious misunderstanding of mercy. God's greatest attribute is His LOVE! God's mercy flows from who God is – Love. (*Fr. Charles*)
