

Re-Opening of Church: Welcome Back! After a little more than three months we thank God for the opportunity to gather once again. As you will see with our new signage, we ask that you monitor your own health, stay home if you have any flu like symptoms, sore throat, cold, fever, etc. If you feel you are high risk, stay home. If you feel more comfortable with less people, then attend weekday Mass. We strongly urge you to wear a mask at all times, except when you are about to approach Fr. Peter or the minister to receive the Communion host on the hand only. For seating, pews have been blocked off. We can sit three individuals, spaced properly, or a single family. Sanitize your hands as you enter. Please enter with proper distancing of more than six feet - both outside and inside of the church. Use the bathroom out of necessity - one person or family at a time. We have trained our new health and safety volunteers to assist you - the ones wearing the safety vests. Please listen to their instructions. They must be followed with no Thank you for your patience and questions. cooperation.

Mass on TV/Web: For those unable to attend, you can watch the Mass at home. Vision TV: Sunday at 8 am; Monday to Friday, 8 am and 12 noon. Saturday, 8:00 am and 9:30 am. Salt & Light: Monday – Saturday, 6:30 am and 9:30 am with the Pope. 11:00 am, 3:00 pm and 10:30 pm; Sunday 10:00 am and 11:30 pm. CHTV at 1:00 pm. You can also see the Mass anytime on the internet.

Blessing with the St. Anne Relic: This weekend (all Masses), we will have special prayers for healing and invoke the intercession of St. Ann. Fr. Peter will bless the parishioners with a special relic of St. Ann at the end of Mass, a relic which has documented healings and special blessings. This year Fr. Mike Isabelle cannot join us, but he has graciously offered to allow us to use the relic this year.

Funeral Mass: We are allowed up to 50 people in church for a funeral Mass. This is the guidelines as mandated by the Bereavement Association of Ontario, the governing body that oversees the funeral homes. Kindness is sign of strength



Dear Parishioners:

Sacred Scripture often depicts the strength and power of God, not so much as brute force and might, but by the depth of His love and kindness. God cares for all His children with no exception. God relates to us in this fashion and by doing so seeks to teach us to do the same.

This may seem obvious but in an angry and polarized world, kindness is often absent, even among those who consider themselves deeply religious and faithful. Kindness and mercy are signs of strength rather than weakness and of closeness to God rather than distance. When we are kind we reveal the presence of God to others. When we fail in kindness, we obscure the light and glory of God.

Kindness is especially needed when confronting sin. Jesus explains in today's parable about the weeds and the wheat. Weeds will always be found among the wheat, i.e. the bad in the midst of the good. Why does God allow this? Because He is patient, kind and merciful. Good and evil will co-mingle until the end of time as humans work out their salvation in fear and trembling. Even noble institutions have a shadow side, whether it be racism, economic exploitation, corruption or sexual abuse. Individuals too are a mixture of light and darkness.

So why does God allow this? Why not simply uproot the evil and darkness? Jesus gives us the answer: To do so would damage the good, too. We need patience, with ourselves and others. Darkness is everywhere but the best way to dispel the darkness is by shining the light of kindness peace, hope, joy and love. The long, winding arch of justice and righteousness will reach its goal and the best way to ensure that is not through force or might, but through kindness and mercy – the way of the Lord.
