FINANCE COUNCIL UPDATE

The collections at Mass – your donations – fund our church and community. The two envelopes you see most often are for the general collection and the mortgage fund. The general collection envelopes are used for regular expenses of the church including staff salaries, taxes, utilities, insurance, and supplies. We also use these collections for ongoing building maintenance such as cleaning the carpet, clearing snow and cutting the lawn. The mortgage fund is used to pay for the mortgage of the rectory that we bought two summers ago.

Your donations qualify as a charitable donation and you receive a charitable tax credit. A tax receipt is issued when your donations are recorded by the parish. The parish can provide you with a box of envelopes allowing you to be registered. The church also provides 'direct debit' from your chequing account as a contribution option and will ensure your donations are regular without the need for an envelope. This will save you from writing cheques, carrying sufficient cash, or missing donations during either vacation time or illness.

There were a number of projects completed this year. They include the construction of a fireproof room upstairs to protect important parish documents, the interior of the church was painted, windows (inside and out) and carpets were cleaned, the library was converted to an office to accommodate our Deacon, John Orban, and the roof of the tower was repaired.

It's worth noting that the labour and materials were free as the roof was still under warranty for one more month. We made it just under the wire and saved thousands of dollars on that project.

The Finance Council hosted a well-received and attended event in early October that addressed estate planning, taxes, and planned giving. This was delivered by a team from diocese and attended by parishioners around the city. There have already been requests for another presentation next year.

Plans for the old rectory behind the church are still being reviewed. We are considering renovating the space for a library, office space, or a meeting area that may accommodate a youth group. An exciting project the finance committee is exploring, is the establishment of a Youth Ministry. The goal is to provide the youth of the parish a place to gather, and to help strengthen the relationship between the church and its youth. This is a project that many people have said is important and wish to establish. We have been in contact with other parishes and the Diocese for information about a youth ministry, and involvement that would be needed by the parish (both financial and parishioner) to move this project forward. The next step would be to have a youth minister or representative of the ministry from another parish or the diocese speak to the congregation directly about such a program.


