## Word from the Pastor

In the beginning of today's gospel, St. Mark 1.29, Peter's mother-in-law "lays sick with a fever." Jesus' healings aren't just physical. If she were living in our time, she could have taken an antibiotic and probably gotten well. But she and we all need more than physical health. The outer signs of Jesus' healings indicate a deeper healing of the whole person. The woman isn't just "cured" of a physical ailment, she is also "healed." No antibiotic could bring that about. Jesus could have cured Peter's mother-in-law by a word of command. But he is more personally involved in her healing. He ministers to her with a personal touch and "helped her up," or as another translation has it, "lifted her up." He is not a detached healer but shows his love and compassion. Love can do that, give people a "lift." It has a healing power that can raise from despair to hope; depression to joy; sin to holiness and even death to life. After the cure, the mother-in-law's service to Jesus and his companions is a response to the "service" Jesus has rendered her. She was grateful for what she had been freely given. We asked for forgiveness from our sins at the beginning of today's Mass. Shall we, the forgiven, leave here and render a "service of forgiveness" to others? Mark shows throughout his gospel that Jesus has the power to conquer suffering and death. Notice again how Mark describes the healing of Peter's mother-in-law - Jesus "helped her up." In other words, Peter's mother-in-law experiences a "resurrection." That is why what he did for her is more than a cure from a sickness, it is a healing. Mark is hinting at the deep inner healing the risen Christ brings us. This new life isn't just for after our death. The woman gets up and serves Jesus and his disciples. She has been healed for Christian ministry by receiving a new life and using it to render service to others.

Please return your blessed palms from last year and place them in the bin at the entrance. They will be burned and used as ashes for Ash Wednesday.

Become a blessing to others. A legacy of faith remains for all as you choose to remember Holy Spirit Parish in your will. For more information contact the Parish Office.

The Litany of Trust is a helpful prayer as we begin the Lenten Season with Ash Wednesday on February 14<sup>th</sup>:

#### LITANY OF TRUST

From the false security that I have what it takes; Deliver me, Jesus.

From the rebellion against childlike dependency on You; Deliver me, Jesus.

From refusals and reluctances in accepting Your will; Deliver me, Jesus.

From anxiety about the future; Deliver me, Jesus.

From resentment or excessive preoccupation with the past; Deliver me, Jesus.

From restless self-seeking in the present moment; Deliver me, Jesus.

From disbelief in Your love and presence; Deliver me, Jesus. From the fear of being asked to give more than I have; Deliver me, Jesus.

From the belief that my life has no meaning or worth; Deliver me, Jesus.

From the fear of what love demands; Deliver me, Jesus.

From discouragement; Deliver me, Jesus.

That You are continually holding me, sustaining me, loving me; Jesus, I trust in You.

That Your love goes deeper than my sins and failings and transforms me; Jesus, I trust in You.

That not knowing what tomorrow brings is an invitation to lean on You; Jesus, I trust in You.

That You are with me in my suffering; Jesus, I trust in You. That my suffering, united to Your own, will bear fruit in this life and the next; Jesus, I trust in You.

That You will not leave me orphan, that You are present in Your Church; Jesus, I trust in You.

That Your plan is better than anything else; Jesus, I trust in You.

That You always hear me and in Your goodness always respond to me; Jesus, I trust in You.

That You give me the grace to accept forgiveness and to forgive others; Jesus, I trust in You.

That You give me all the strength I need for what is asked; Jesus, I trust in You.

That my life is a gift; Jesus, I trust in You.

That You will teach me to trust You; Jesus, I trust in You.

That You are my Lord and my God; Jesus, I trust in You.

That I am Your beloved one; Jesus, I trust in You.
