Take Five for Faith: Daily renewal for busy Catholics Appointed to the task We see them in some of our parishes standing near the presider at Mass: men dressed sort of like priests but with a diagonal or odd-looking stole. What are deacons for, we may wonder? Deacons assist priests in visiting the sick and provide service in the parish community. They can preach, witness marriages, perform Baptisms, and preside at funeral services outside of Mass. While they're ordained clergy, they may also be married and serve without pay. The permanent diaconate is a special call for those "filled with the Spirit and wisdom." Know someone who fits this description? Encourage him to apply.

<u>Synod FAQ:</u> Would ordaining women as permanent deacons open the door to ordaining women as priests?

A: Pope John Paul said the Church "has no authority whatsoever to confer priestly ordination on women". The ordination of women as permanent deacons does not change this teaching. The diaconate is a "proper and permanent" order that is distinct from the priesthood. The Catechism of the Catholic Church makes this distinction: "Bishops and priests receive the mission and faculty ('the sacred power') to act in persona Christi Capitis [in the person of Christ the Head]; deacons receive the strength to serve the People of God in the diaconia of liturgy, word, and charity, in communion with the bishop and his presbyterate" (No. 875). In 2009, Pope Benedict revised canon law to clearly differentiate among deacons, priests and bishops. Join Team Holy Spirit! Louise Beggs at louisebeggs@icloud.com, 613-852-4469

Good news:

1. Our new Synod document: the Vatican released the "Instrumentum laboris" the core document for the Synod of Bishops (including some lay people) this October. We are encouraged to read it and work through the questions (www.cbcew.org.uk/wp-content/uploads/sites/3/2023/06/ synod-instrumentum-laboris.pdf). It specifically asks if we can imagine women as deacons, and how.

2. St. Phoebe Celebrations this <u>September 3 to10</u>! Msgr. Joe would like us to focus on St. Phoebe, a woman deacon in the early Church, that week. On the weekend of <u>September 9 &10</u>, a lay woman will offer a reflection on St. Phoebe after Communion at each of our three Masses. We look forward to seeing you there!
