

# Word from the Pastor

Good Shepherd Sunday: It is several weeks since Easter. We have returned to the ordinary part of our lives. We are 'back home' after the Resurrection. We need guidance, someone to walk with us and speak to us as we go along, lest we wander off. What a wonderful image then, this shepherding Christ. The Scriptures are filled with images for God and Christ. Each image conveys some reality about who God is to us -- God is rock, liberator, ruler, creator, father, mother, etc. In John's Gospel, there are ample images for who Jesus is to us -- truth, way, life, bread, living water, etc. Each suggests some facet of our relationship with him, each tries to help us catch the depth of the reality of Christ in our lives. The Shepherd image suggests a profound relationship: "I know my sheep and my sheep know me, in the same way that the Father knows me and I know the Father." The bond between the Shepherd and us is likened to the bond that exists between Christ and the Father. Does this powerful expression of intimacy encourage us to trust Christ each step of the journey, both in the arduous times and the easier ones?

Take Five for Faith: Daily renewal for busy Catholics Flying in formation Did you think that Catholic cardinals came to be so called because their red robes were reminiscent of the birds with the same name? Nope—it's actually the other way around. Cardinals—that is, the senior members of the clergy—wear red because it symbolizes their willingness to sacrifice for their faith. The birds came to be called cardinals because they reminded people of the red-clad men who make up the church's College of Cardinals. The word cardinal comes from the Latin word for "hinge"—upon which a gate or door opens. Pray for these leaders and their flocks to open their eyes, ears, and hearts as we find our way together into the future church.

We are called to take responsibility for our personal health: to prevent illness and to seek a healthy lifestyle. Good health concerns the physical, emotional, social and spiritual health of our communities, respect for God's creatures and the nurturing of the whole earth.

**Happy MOTHER'S DAY** "She is clothed with strength and dignity; she can laugh at the days to come. She speaks with wisdom, and faithful instruction is on her tongue. She watches over the affairs of her household and does not eat the bread of idleness. Her children arise and call her blessed; her husband also, and he praises her." Proverb 31.24-28

Listening is an art. Too often, in our human condition, we listen only partially, because we are already formulating our response. When we really listen, without distraction or prejudice, we may hear "good news" or "bad news". "Bad news" may be the truth that we do not want to hear from someone, even though we may have said it to ourselves. "Good news" is usually positive and adds to the opinion and attitude that we already have. When we really listen to the Word of God, we also can be only partially engaged. This is a skill that we must develop, over time, in our relationship with God, and in our relationship with others - vertical and horizontal. The Word of God is eternal and universal – for all times and all places. Too often, people like to limit the power of the Word, and convince themselves that what Jesus said two thousand years ago couldn't have any relevance today. When we do listen, we may be surprised at what we receive! When I take time with the scriptures, and especially preparing a Sunday reflection, I notice something my eyes have passed over many times before and not really noticed. My attention is captured because something resonates with what is presently going on in my life. The Word has an intimate meaning for me. All of a sudden, the Word leaps off the page, because perhaps for the first time the particular Word touches one's life in a personal way. Even though someone has heard that gospel every three years, in the liturgical cycle, or have read it often, it didn't "ring a bell" until their lived experience and situation helped the message touch their heart. The Word has that power, if we allow it!


