**Our on-going Synod:** The Synod is going to discern one year longer, until October 2024. Pope Francis will ask the whole Church to discern with the Synod of Bishops on the "Document on the Continental Stage" in two sessions, the first October 4-29, 2023; then the second in October 2024.

"This decision stems from the desire that the theme of a Synodal Church, because of its breadth and importance, might be the subject of prolonged discernment not only by the members of the Synodal Assembly, but by the whole Church." Please keep praying that the Holy Spirit will be heard and will guide us all.

## *Word from the Pastor*

From today's second Letter of Paul to Timothy: "The Lord will rescue me from every evil threat and will bring me safe to his heavenly kingdom. To him be glory forever and ever. Amen" Paul's trust in God isn't based on his own merits, but on the Lord who, "will rescue me from every evil threat and will bring me safe to his heavenly kingdom." Like the tax collector in today's gospel, Paul is not the subject of the sentence, he is the object, that is, the recipient of Christ's graciousness. Do I subtly take credit for my good works, or do I see God as their source? What are my gifts to offer in God's service? Do I acknowledge and thank God for them?

**Take Five for Faith: Daily renewal for busy Catholics**  
**The other cheek is forgiveness** Think it's hard to "turn the other cheek"? What if someone stabbed you in the cheek in an attempt to kill you?! While you imagine what you'd do in that situation, consider what Saint Anthony Mary Claret did when it actually happened to him: He got his would-be assassin's death sentence commuted. As the archbishop of Santiago, Cuba in the mid-1800s, Claret had made enemies by advocating for the downtrodden and denouncing racism. He's an example that turning the other cheek is not a passive action, as some might think, because it has two parts: first, not responding in kind, and then, actively giving a second chance to the offender to do the right thing. Such brave love can and has stopped hate in its tracks.
