After being shut down for more than two years, the Catechesis of the Good Shepherd program will be starting up this fall. This program is jointly administered through Holy Redeemer and Holy Spirit parishes. The atrium, that special place where children and catechists gather, is located at St. Joseph House on Holy Spirit Church property. The program will begin in early October. Level 1 (ages 3-5 years) will be offered. Level 1 sessions will be held Wednesday mornings from 9:30 to 11:15 beginning October 12th. The Synodal process is on the homestretch as indicated by the "national synthesis" report sent to Rome to be included in the deliberations coming to conclusion next year in October 2023. This report is the culmination of a sincere listening exercise that occurred in every diocese across the country. What was most present in the regional reports has been included in the national synthesis, providing a thorough and thoughtful account of the exchanges which took place during the initial phase of the synodal process. "Catholics in Canada want their Church to be relevant and engaged in our world's ongoing transformation. They recognize an urgent need for the Church to undergo a profound missionary renewal" said the Most Rev. Raymond Poisson, President of the CCCB, and member of the Canadian National Synthesis Writing Team.



### Word from the Pastor

The gospel today guides our prayer. Whatever stage of our journey we are on, we can learn from the band of lepers and pray, "Jesus, Master, have pity on us." I know that the word 'pity' makes some of us feel uncomfortable. We don't want anyone's pity. But we can learn a lesson from the lepers. They have no pretense and no pride to block the expression of their feelings. They see the one who can help them and they cry out their need. But the lepers aren't cured right away. Jesus orders them to go show themselves to the priests. Like Elisha's healing of Naaman, Jesus is not present for their healings. The ten are healed having responded to Jesus' word and are on the way to show themselves to the priests. Ten lepers were made clean, cured of their skin problems, but only one like Naaman, returns to give thanks to the source of his healing. Which causes us to ask: does our faith ever spill over into joyful gratitude and exuberant thanksgiving? Naaman and the lepers' healings were gifts, like grace, not based on their worthiness, but on their need and God's bounty. Gratitude is a gift we give God, a response to what is clear to our eyes: God's forgiveness has cleansed us of our sins. All we can say is, "thank you," as we do at this Eucharist. When we leave this celebration shall we extend to others the forgiveness we have been freely given? Are there people the world treats as lepers we need to reach out to? Perhaps we have healing words for them, like Elisha and Jesus had for those who reached out to them.

Take Five for Faith: Daily renewal for busy Catholics Forgive us our trespasses It has now been a few months since Pope Francis apologized in Canada for the church's role in running boarding schools that profoundly hurt indigenous people. His message was both embraced for its acknowledgement of wrong and criticized for not being enough. Papal apologies are relatively new, beginning with Pope John Paul II apologizing in the 1980s for the church's role in the slave trade. Since then, popes have asked forgiveness for sexual abuse, treatment of Jews, and inaction during the Holocaust. An apology is a first step toward repairing a wrong. Reflecting on your own life, have you taken that step when needed? *"Woe to you, scholars of the law! You have taken away the key of* 

knowledge."
