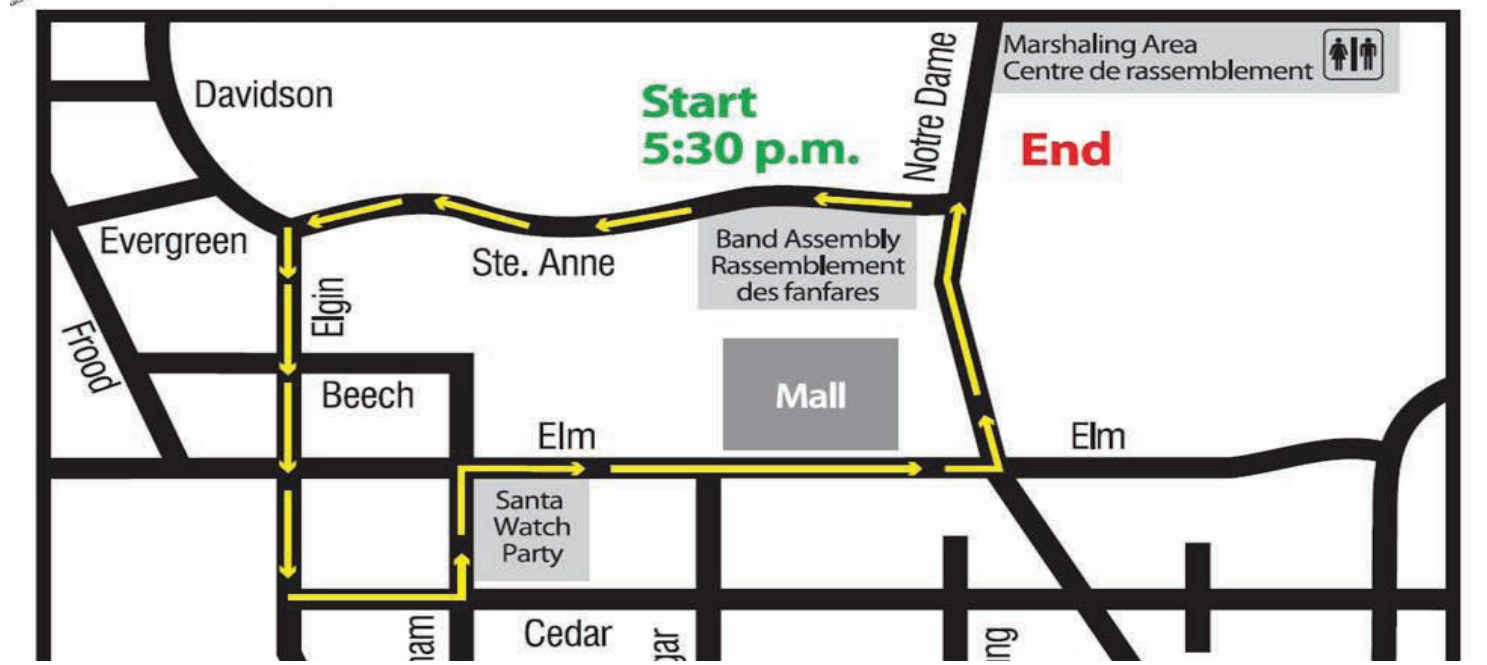

THE BLOOD RED POPPY – Comrade Rick Grylls The blood red poppy of Flanders, immortalized as an emblem of Sacrifice and emembrance for the honouring of the thousands who laid down their lives for those ideals which we as Canadians cherish. The poppy calls upon us to remember not only those who have died but also those they have left dependent and those who still suffer from honourable wounds and disabilities. The poppy challenges us to serve in peace, as in War, to help those who need our help and to protect those who need our protection.

Saint’s Corner. This month’s saint, Blessed Andre Grasset, was born in Canada but moved back with his parents to France after the Battle of Quebec. He and many other priests were imprisoned in the French Revolution era because they refused to sign the The Civil Constitution of the Clergy. He died as a martyr in 1792 and was beatified with a large group of martyrs in 1926. He is also the first beatified Canadian; not long after that a College in his name was opened in Montreal. He was born in Montreal in 1758 after his parents came to New France in 1749.

Fast Facts:

- Over the course of the 2017/2018 Winter season, OTS had over 450 uniquely identified individuals who accessed services at the shelter and on average 38 beds were used per night.
- From November 1, 2017- April 15, 2018 there were 3,461 individuals who used the shelter for referral and outreach services only, and as a result of those services 33 individuals were able to find permanent housing.
- Throughout the 2017/2018 season, the shelter had a 125.92% occupancy rate. This number is based on 30 funded beds.
