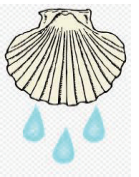

Do you know of someone who is considering becoming catholic? Soon our parish will start the RCIA program which prepares adults for the Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist). It also prepares those adults who have been baptized in another faith for full Communion with the Catholic Church. Finally, it is an excellent opportunity for Catholics who want to update their understanding of the Church's teachings. Sessions will be held every 2nd Wednesday evening from 7:00-8:30pm beginning on November 6 and ending on April 1. There are also periodic liturgical celebrations held at the regular Sunday Mass. **If anyone is interested in participating in this journey of faith, please register with the parish office by Tuesday, October 29th.**



At Christ the King, it is our custom each year to have a special ceremony remembering those deceased persons who have had funeral services through the parish during the one-year period of November 2nd to November 2nd.
