MASS INTENTIONS

A number of years ago, a document was produced by the Diocese to help us understand why we have Mass intentions. Today we would like to revise that document in order to help us understand the importance of the Mass in the life of Catholic Christians.

Part 1: For whom do we pray at Mass?

Masses are celebrated as means of prayer for the living and the dead. We know that at the Last Supper, Jesus commanded his Apostles, "Do this in memory of me." We also know through the Acts of the Apostles that the characteristics of the early church were that they came together in communion, were faithful to the teaching of the Apostles, The Breaking of the Bread and prayer. (Acts 2:42)

Ancient tradition tells us that during the Roman persecutions, Christians would often gather in the catacombs of Rome to celebrate the Eucharist at the tombs of the early martyrs. There was a growing awareness that when the community came together in prayer there was a strength that came not only from those present, but from the prayers of those who had preceded them (the communion of saints). After the time of persecution, when the Eucharist was able to be celebrated in homes, the growing Christian community prayed for each other and often included in their prayers their loved ones who had died. The custom therefore of having Mass intentions for the living as well as for the dead became a practice that finds its origin at the beginning of the Christian era.
