Each year as we celebrate New Year's, it is an invitation for us to reflect upon the year that has gone by and to look forward to the year that is beginning. The fear of infection has caused us to distance ourselves from family and friends and has created a sense of isolation for far too many people. We can look forward to 2021 with a sense of hope that God has given wisdom and insight to doctors and researchers that will help us stem the tide of this pandemic. May God, who has been, and is, and will be our source of strength fill us with all the strength we need to experience peace this New Year.
