BAPTISM OF THE LORD

Baptism is the first sacrament of the Christian faith whereby we become children of God and are welcomed into the Church community. Accompanied by very simple and meaningful gestures, water is used to symbolize our new life in Christ.

What's interesting about the sacrament of Baptism is that neither Jesus nor the early Christian Church started this tradition. It was a Jewish tradition, on that was made popular by the great prophet, John the Baptist, also called the Baptizer. Appalled by the casual religious practices of the people of his era, John baptized his followers in water as a sign of purification and penance. The Evangelists made a point of recording that Jesus went to John the Baptist to be baptized. That gesture demonstrated Jesus' affection for the religion which he had practiced from birth and his respect for tradition. For all intents and purposes, Christ's Baptism in water inaugurated his public life.

Jesus' Baptism was also remarkable because of its profound and extraordinary spiritual experience. A voice was heard from the heavens: *This is my Son, the Beloved, with whom I am well pleased.* St. John's baptism was one of purification; Jesus' baptism confirmed his divinity. Since then, Christian Baptism is celebrated in Christ's name with water and the Holy Spirit.

Jesus and the members of the early Church took John's baptismal rite and radically transformed it. From that time on, Baptism has been the rite of our divine affiliation. At his Baptism, Jesus was revealed as the Son of God. At our own Baptism, each of us is welcomed as a child of God. While we thank St. John for our heritage, we thank Christ for bringing this new reality to us.

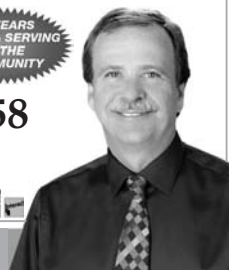
