#### PRIESTS' PENSION PLAN

The Priests' Pension Plan Annual Collection will take place on *Sunday, November 5<sup>th</sup>*. Last year's collection generated \$66,180. We are very appreciative of your concern for our welfare. You may recall that when we began seeking your help, the monthly pension was at \$750. The number of retired priests outnumber the active priests by a ratio of almost 2 to 1. In July of 2014 we were able to raise the pension to \$800./ month. Our target is to reach \$1,100. and we had hoped to implement another adjustment to \$875./month effective July 1<sup>st</sup> of 2016. However, because of continued falling interest rates plus a change in the mortality experience (people are living longer, therefore more money is required to pay the monthly pension), we have had to postpone increasing the monthly pension. There is a current deficit that must first be eliminated before we can consider a change and this will likely take a few years.
