Words of Thanks

Let us thank God for blessing our Holy Week and Triduum celebrations: many thanks to the choir, our lectors, servers, ushers and extraordinary ministers, our sacristans, decorators and parish staff. Such great numbers of people participated in these sacred days. Thank you to all who gave so generously to the Good Friday and Easter collections. May the Lord bless you and continue to pour out upon one and all his paschal gifts of peace and joy!

The Easter Season

The Easter Season is comprised of fifty days. Early Christians extended their festivity for seven weeks (like their Jewish brethren celebrating Passover) and brought it to a fitting conclusion on the Fiftieth Day (Pentecost). Although we think of Easter as the end of Lent, it is truly a time of transition from Lent's preparation to Easter's celebration. Why 50 days? Attention to the symbolic meaning of numbers was more pronounced in the ancient Church than it is today and 7 times 7, with a celebration on the next day (the 8th day, symbolic of the time beyond the structure of human weeks), would have fascinated our ancestors in the faith and provided them a foretaste of the eternal banquet.

The Gospels for the Sundays of Easter give strong colour to the season. The first three Sundays of Easter relate appearances of Jesus after the Resurrection. The fourth Sunday always focuses on the powerful image of the Good Shepherd and the three Sundays before Pentecost draw from the 'farewell discourse' or 'high-priest prayer' of Jesus at the Last Supper as recorded in the Gospel of John.

Easter is not only remembering something that happened long ago, it is Christ dead and risen in our midst. It is the Holy Spirit breathing on us today. For Easter is made present in the newly baptized including many thousands of adults who have come into the Church at the Easter Vigil. Easter is made present in those who will be confirmed during this Season and in the children of our parish and of parishes throughout the world that will be brought to the altar for their First Holy Communion.

There is a great mystery to learn and a great mission to begin. Easter is for unlocking doors and for unlocking hearts and partaking in everything that is wholesome, healthy and holy! Easter is the season for learning the language of the Spirit, for climbing Sinai that the law of the Lord which we reflected upon during Lent, might be etched into our hearts, and that we might accept anew the great commission of the Risen Lord: "Go, therefore and make disciples of all nations…"
