

**ST. RAPHAEL GREEN CORNER:** *Pope Francis writes: "This (ecological) conversion calls for a number of attitudes which together foster a* 

spirit of generous care, full of tenderness. First it entails gratitude and gratuitousness, a recognition that the world is God's loving gift." Ls #220 Pope Francis reminds us that an ecological conversion must include gratitude for the gifts of God's Creation. Included in the gifts of God's creation are the forests that cover our earth. On this past March 21st we celebrated World Forestry Day. Did you know that forests play a major role in the health of our Earth? According to Environment Canada, a 30% forest cover is the minimum threshold for a healthy ecological state. The urban tree canopy in Burlington is sitting at a low 15-17%. At this rate, less than one-half of the potential species richness can be supported and our aquatic and terrestrial ecosystems are deemed only marginally healthy. Did you know that trees:

\*Decrease air pollution through filtration and oxygen generation

\*Improve shade cover, wind barriers and temperature control year-round (lowering energy costs) \*Assist with stormwater management in built environments

\*Provide habitats to birds and other wildlife

\*Decrease water runoff, creek degradation and flooding \*Increase value of neighbourhoods, aesthetic, and overall

curb appeal Give gratitude to God for trees. Do what you can to support the health of trees in your neighbourhood and visit a nearby forest soon.

#### 1. What does "Triduum" mean?

It comes from Latin roots that mean, essentially, "the three days" or "period of three days". Today it refers to the liturgical season that follows Lent and precedes the Easter season. According to the main document governing the celebrations connected with Easter, *Paschales Solemnitatis: 38*, This time is called "the triduum of the crucified, buried and risen".

#### 2. When does Triduum begin and end?

According to the *General Norms for the Liturgical Year and the Calendar: 19*, The Easter triduum begins with the evening Mass of the Lord's Supper, reaches its high point in the Easter Vigil, and closes with evening prayer on Easter Sunday.

This means that Triduum thus runs from the evening of Holy Thursday to the evening of Easter Sunday. It thus includes three full days, though since the season doesn't begin at midnight, these three days are distributed as follows: The last part of Holy Thursday - Good Friday-Holy Saturday - The first part of Easter Sunday

#### 3. Why is Triduum important?

According to the *General Norms: 18*, Christ redeemed us all and gave perfect glory to God principally through his paschal mystery: dying he destroyed our death, and rising he restored our life. Therefore, the Easter triduum of the passion and resurrection of Christ is the culmination of the entire liturgical year. Thus, the solemnity of Easter has the same kind of preeminence in the liturgical year that Sunday has in the week.

In conclusion, the Triduum begins with Holy Thursday and ends with Easter. The mass begins on Holy Thursday and the final blessing (which is commonly the end of the mass) happens only on Easter.
