

As we continue celebrating the Easter Season, cultivate a relationship with creation and interact in deeper harmony

with all created order. Pope Francis writes: As a spiritual work of mercy, care for our common home calls for a "grateful contemplation of God's world" (Laudato Si', 214) which "allows us to discover in each thing a teaching which God wishes to hand on to us" (ibid., 85). As a corporal work of mercy, care for our common home requires "simple daily gestures which break with the logic of violence, exploitation and selfishness" and "makes itself felt in every action that seeks to build a better world" (ibid., 230-31). (Message of Pope Francis for the Celebration of World Day of Prayer for the care of Creation 2016) Are you planning to do some Spring Cleaning this month? Remember that clean reusable clothing and reusable household articles can be donated to re-use centres in our community that benefit those who are unable to purchase new clothing or household materials.
