



CWL Resolution: 2015.02 Ban Microbeads in Personal Care Products. We have just celebrated Earth Day. Did you know that the Catholic Women's League passed this

resolution and presented it to Federal Government? Plastic-non-biodegradable microbeads in personal care products have been identified as a source of pollution in waterways; therefore the CWL asked that it be added to List of Toxic Substances in Schedule 1 of the Canadian Environment Protection Act, 1999. Scientists have identified micoplastics which include microbeads as a major source of plastic pollution in the freshwater ecosystems of the Great Lakes. (Canadian Gazette) "Once in the environment, microbeads can be ingested by a wide range of organisms, such as fish, seals, and birds. Therefore, it is possible that microbeads enter the food chain".
