

Pope Francis writes: "Some forms of pollution are part of people's daily experience. Exposure to atmospheric

pollutants produces a broad spectrum of health hazards, especially for the poor, and causes millions of premature deaths. People take sick, for example, from breathing high levels of smoke from fuels used in cooking or heating. There is also pollution that affects everyone, caused by transport, industrial fumes, substances which contribute to the acidification of soil and water, fertilizers, insecticides, fungicides, herbicides and agrotoxins in general." It is our responsibility to protect the environment, which gives us resources to find the cure of some diseases. Did you know?

•At least half of the world's people are currently unable to obtain essential health services.

•Almost 100 million people are being pushed into extreme poverty, forced to survive on just \$1.90 or less a day, because they must pay for health services out of their own pockets.

•Over 800 million people (almost 12 percent of the world's population) spend at least 10 percent of their household budgets on health expenses for themselves, a sick child or other family member. They incur in so-called "catastrophic expenditures".

• Incurring catastrophic expenses for health care is a global problem. In richer countries in Europe, Latin America and parts of Asia, which have achieved high levels of access to health services, increasing numbers of people are spending at least 10 percent of their household budgets on out-of-pocket health expenses (World Health Organization).

"Jesus taught that if we would "first seek God's Reign" (Matthew 6:33) and obey his command to "love God and love one another" (Matthew 22:37-40), all the rest would take care of itself. We would no longer defy the laws of nature but seek to live in harmony and sustainability with Earth and all her creatures." *Richard Rohr* This week reflect on living in harmony and sustainability with all the Earth and all Earth's creatures!
