

On the **18th Sunday in Ordinary Time**, we are in the second of five Sunday gospels from the 6th chapter of **John's Gospel** and the Bread of Life readings. For this **Nineteenth Sunday of Ordinary Time** we finish our third Sunday with the Bread of Life readings from the 6th chapter of **John's Gospel**, meditating on the words of Jesus who reveals that he is the bread of life.
