#### ST. RAPHAEL EVERGREEN CORNER

Pope Francis writes: "The earth's resources are also being plundered because of short-sighted approaches to

the economy, commerce and production. The loss of forests and woodlands entails the loss of species which may constitute extremely important resources in the future, not only for food but also for curing disease and other uses. Different species contain genes which could be key resources in years ahead for meeting human needs and regulating environmental problems." Laudato si #32 Having a Green Christmas does not need to be a challenge! We can protect the biodiversity of our world, which is God's gift to us, in a number of different ways! When we use wrapping paper to wrap our Christmas gifts, we in effect promote the cutting down of trees and degradation of forests and we also create more garbage and pollution! Christmas wrapping paper cannot be recycled! Instead of using wrapping paper consider using a cloth bag, decorated newsprint or plain brown paper. Perhaps you might even use some of the paper from Christmas flyers to wrap gifts. Did you know that Burlington Green is offering to wrap Christmas Gifts in environmentally friendly wrap at Mountain Equipment Co-op on the weekend of Dec. 10-11<sup>th</sup>?

Trees are home to many of our bird friends, insects and animals. Make a gift to nature this Christmas by hanging a **bird feeder** or better still give a gift of a bird feeder to a child in your family. Consider buying a green plant for a loved one. Plants, seasonal bulbs, herbs and trees provide enjoyment and hope that last long past Christmas. Purchase a **fabric bag gift** that can be folded and easily carried for shopping. Consider purchasing a refillable water bottle as a gift for family members and friends, and buy one for yourself while you are at it! Send e-cards and Christmas greetings rather than purchasing and sending cards in the mail. If you are thinking of purchasing a Christmas tree, purchase a live tree that can be composted after Christmas or consider a live tree in a **pot** that can be planted in the spring! *Think Green this* Christmas!

NATIONAL DAY OF PRAYER IN SOLIDARITY WITH INDIGENOUS PEOPLES: The Aboriginal Council and the Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops have promoted the annual National Day of Prayer since 2002. It is celebrated on **December 12**, the memorial of **Our Lady** of Guadalupe, whom Pope Pius XII proclaimed patroness of the Americas in 1946. The devotion dates to 1531 when the Blessed Mother appeared as an Aztec princess to a humble Aboriginal peasant, Saint Juan Diego [Feast day is December 9], at a place called the Hill of Tepeyac, which eventually became part of Villa de Guadalupe, a suburb of Mexico City. Pope Francis will celebrate Mass in Saint Peter's Basilica on December 12 in honour of Our Lady of Guadalupe, with prayers especially for the Church in the Americas. The celebration will be accompanied by a number of ancient liturgical hymns composed in various Indigenous languages from Central America.
