FOURTH DAY OF THE LORD IN ADVENT Receive Emmanuel - Mary's gift to us

On this fourth Sunday of Advent our preoccupation in our work places, schools and families might be on Christmas parties, Christmas meal preparations, Christmas holiday vacation destinations and Christmas gifts. The liturgy does not eliminate these aspects of the Christmas celebration, but does call us to focus on Mary's preparation for her gift to us of Emmanuel [Jesus], her Bethlehem destination [not a vacation, but a journey to the "House of Bread'] and above all to Emmanuel- God-is-with-Us, the King of Glory. Like Joseph, we are called to celebrate and receive Emmanuel, Mary's gift. Fr. Frank

ST. RAPHAEL <u>EVERGREEN</u> CORNER Fourth Week of Advent: **O Come**, **O Come Emmanuel!** Pope Francis writes; "*Christian spirituality proposes*

an alternative understanding of the quality of life, and encourages a prophetic and contemplative lifestyle, one capable of deep enjoyment free of the obsession with consumption. We need to take up an ancient lesson, found in different religious traditions and also in the Bible. It is the conviction that 'less is more'. A constant flood of new consumer goods can baffle the heart and prevent us from cherishing each thing and each moment. To be serenely present to each reality, however small it may be, opens us to greater horizons of understanding and personal fulfillment. Christian spirituality proposes a growth marked by moderation and the capacity to be happy with little. It is a return to that simplicity which allows us to stop and appreciate the small things, to be grateful for the opportunities which life affords us, to be spiritually detached from what we possess, and not to succumb to sadness for what we lack. This implies avoiding the dynamic of dominion and the mere accumulation of pleasures." Laudato si #222

The biblical conviction that "less is more" can be lived out in many ways at Christmas! Mass produced goods including items for children are often overly packaged in moulded plastic, card board, and more plastic! Choose gifts that are simply packaged in recyclable materials or purchase gifts made with recyclable materials.
