

MATTHEW'S GOSPEL THE KINGDOM OF HEAVEN: THE REIGN OF GOD

In the first major writing of Pope Francis to the Church, the Apostolic Exhortation, Evangelii Gaudium, The Joy of the Gospel, he urged those preaching to use their homilies to bring the joy of the Lord to the world. This weekend, all three readings tell us that the world does not have to be a place of hatred with its accompanying anger and violence. A Savior has come who has presented a new way of living, a new law, a Law of Joy. We can experience the Reign of God even now. The Law of Joy says if we check our desire for vengeance, we can live in peace with ourselves and our God. If we refuse to be dominated by hatred, we can remain united to the One who is Love Become Flesh. If there is only one person in the workplace who lives by this New Law, the workplace will experience the presence of the Lord in that person. With the Grace of the Holy Spirit working through this person, the workplace can become a place of joy. All the pettiness that we suffer from others, all the hatred that others cast on us, all the scheming that others might attempt, does not matter. What matters is the Love of God and the joy we have in Jesus Christ, our Lord. The New Law of the Kingdom of God, calls us to forgive, to turn from anger, to be kind, and to live in peace. ST. RAPHAEL <u>EVERGREEN</u> CORNER Pope Francis writes: "Climate Change's worst impact will probably be felt by developing countries in coming

decades. Many of the poor live in areas particularly affected by phenomena related to warming, and their means of subsistence are largely dependent on natural reserves and eco- systemic services such as agriculture, fishing and forestry. They have no other financial activities or resources which can enable them to adapt to climate change or to face natural disasters, and their access to social services and protection is very limited. For example, changes in climate, to which animals and plants cannot adapt, lead them to migrate; this in turn affects the livelihood of the poor, who are then forced to leave their homes, with great uncertainty for their future and that of their children." In our First Reading today from Isaiah we are reminded that the fast that God has chosen for us is "to loose the bonds of injustice" of the poor and to "let the oppressed go free"! God reminds us of our great responsibility for all of our brothers and sisters especially the poorest in our world and all of God's created beings. Climate Change affects all of us but affects the least and the poorest of our world. It is our responsibility as members of the Body of Christ to do what we can in our small everyday ordinary actions to reduce and be responsible with the amount of resources of our world that we consume. WORLD DAY OF SOCIAL JUSTICE: The United Nations' (UN) World Day of Social Justice is annually observed on **February 20** to encourage people to look at how social justice affects poverty eradication. It also focuses on the goal of achieving full employment and support for social integration.

METANOIA is a Greek word. That's **repentance** in English. Blessed Pope Paul VI in the APOSTOLIC CONSTITUTION PAENITEMINI states: *Christ, who always practiced in His life what He preached, before beginning His ministry spent 40 days and 40 nights in prayer and fasting, and began His public mission with the joyful message: "The kingdom of God is at hand." To this He added the command: "Repent and believe in the Gospel."(33) The Kingdom of God announced by Christ can be entered only by a* <u>"change of heart"</u>

("metanoia") that is to say through that intimate and total change and renewal of the entire man—of all his opinions, judgments and decisions—which takes place in him in the light of the sanctity and charity of God, the sanctity and charity which were manifested to us in the Son and communicated fully. (34) Metanoia, then is about the growth in the spiritual life in all its aspects with the help of God's grace. It is a turning from what keeps us from turning to God with all our heart. It is the change of heart we are invited to have especially during the Lenten time.



WORLD DAY OF PRAYER 2017 - Before the World Wide Web, there was the World Day of Prayer, an international event that has been connecting women (and all people) in a

meaningful way for almost a century. Too often, women have the intimate experiences of armed conflict, violence, social injustice, and human rights violations. What might Canadians learn from women of the Philippines, a country on the front lines of climate change, foreign mining and resources interests, a regional insurgency and social upheaval due to migration, who wrote the World Day of Prayer 2017?
