

Single Use Plastics are not only a source of pollution in the oceans but also contribute to the amount of garbage that does not decompose. Considering efforts to recycle single use plastics, the majority of single use plastics end up in landfill sites.

Here are 7 Ways to Immediately Eliminate Single Use Plastics from our lives!

***Say no to plastic straws!** Carry your own stainless steel recyclable straw. In Canada we use 57 million plastic straws a day-they are not recyclable.

**Carry and use a refillable water bottle*. More than half of plastic water bottles end up in the garbage!

**Carry your own refillable coffee cup.* 4 billion Starbucks coffee cups are thrown away each year and the black plastic lids from disposable coffee cups are not recyclable.

***Use a reusable bag when shopping**: canvas or nylon is best: they can be washed. *In Canada we use over 9 billion plastic bags each year.*

*Instead of plastic bags for produce bring your own reusable/washable cotton or mesh bags.

***Bring your own containers for leftovers** when dining out and when ordering take-out food.

*Use bar soap instead of liquid soap in plastic bottles. If we all resolve to make a few sustainable changes in our lives, we can protect the environment and live healthier lives.

ASH WEDNESDAY: On March 2, Ash Wednesday, we will have mass and distribution of ashes at **9am**, **12 noon** and **7pm**. All are welcome. Ash Wednesday is a day of fasting and abstinence from meat.

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK: On March 2nd we begin the season of Lent, marking ourselves with the symbol of ashes on our forehead. Even though it might seem to be a time of mortification, when properly understood, it stands as a time of grace and a holy season. The mother church offers us a time, set apart to reflect on the special, sacrificial love that God has for us.

So, it is also a **Time for a Change of Heart.** Lent gives us time to consider our response to the Gospel's call to love of God and neighbor: the New Law of Christ, written on our hearts by the Spirit at Baptism. Our Lenten prayer is thus one of repentance for sin, which fails to meet the demands of charity. It asks for a change of heart, that God might restore in us the heart of Christ, bestowed at Baptism.

It is also a Time for Renewing our Trust. The

resurrection experience of Jesus tells us that in him, we can trust that the Father will raise us in the power of the Spirit from the small deaths we so often seem to undergo during Lent, so that we might joyfully celebrate the fullness of life that is our inheritance through Baptism, at Easter.

So, dear brothers and sisters, I invite you to take this time to feel and experience the love that God has for us. We could experience this in various ways. For instance, being gentle with each other, showing the love of God to others, being mindful and intentional in our actions. Another important way is to participate in the liturgies of Lent, the stations of the cross, the Eucharist, fasting, and obstinance. I particularly invite you to participate in the tradition of walking the stations of the cross and reflecting the love that Christ has for us. During the season of Lent, we have mass on Friday evening as well, starting at 6.30 p.m. followed by the stations.

May this season of lent be a blessing for you and your family. Happy season of Lent.
