The fashion industry is a huge contributor to the climate and ecological emergency. It impacts countless workers and communities around the world who are being exploited in order for some to enjoy fast fashion that many treat as disposable.

Why is sustainable fashion so important? Sustainable fashion saves water, ensures fair wages, and ensures proper working conditions

There is something we can do: sustainable brands focus on quality clothing products made from long-lasting materials which extend their lifespan. By extending the life cycle of our garments (especially our cotton garments) by nine months, we can reduce the water footprint of our clothing by about 5-10%. It's not a huge amount, but it is a case for buying less, buying well and making it last! Huge quantities of fresh water are used in the dyeing and finishing process of our clothes. As reference, it can take up to 200 tons of fresh water per ton of dyed fabric and up to 20,000 liters of water to produce just 1kg of cotton
