EPIPHANY OF THE LORD THE WORD-MADE-FLESH DWELLS IN THE WHOLE WORLD

A thing or an event in which a god is revealed is called an epiphany. Our Bible tells epiphany stories: it is the great story of God's **quest to be known by the whole world**. God is constantly trying to break through to us, to overcome our limitations **so that everyone can know God**. Those who recognize God in the events of their lives can be called wise, like the gift-bearing men in the gospel. These wise men have read the signs well. With their gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh, they recognize the child as a king, over whose life the shadow of death is looming. **Those who read God's signs and understand are sent to be epiphanies for all the nations and peoples of the world.** Perhaps this is the only real gift we have to give. *Fr. SOLEMNITY OF MARY MOTHER OF GOD THE WORD-MADE-FLESH DWELT IN MARY'S WOMB In the fullness of time, scripture says, the Word of God became human and dwelt among us: the Word-Made-Flesh: earth was forever joined to heaven. God does not cling to the safety of heaven: God takes shelter in the womb of young girl. The child of Bethlehem is the son of Mary and the son of God. Mary is presented as a treasure chest. She bore within her womb the living Word of God, the bringer of God's salvation. She ponders in her heart words spoken of him. There is much naming today. An angel names him: Jesus, "God saves." Mary is named the mother of God. God's name is upon us; we are called **God's people**. The Spirit within us cries out, "Father! Father!" We are God's children. THE JUBILEE OF MERCY BANNER

The scene is captured within the so called *mandorla* (the shape of an almond), a figure quite important in early and medieval iconography, for it calls to mind the two natures of Christ, divine and human. The three concentric ovals. with colors

progressively lighter as we move outward, suggest the **movement of Christ who carries humanity out of the night of sin and death.** Conversely, the depth of the darker color suggests the impenetrability of the love of the Father who forgives all.
