

THE REIGN OF GOD FOR THE WHOLE WORLD EPIPHANY: A thing or event in which a god is revealed or manifested is called an epiphany. Our Bible tells epiphany stories: it is the great story of God's quest to be known by the whole world. God is constantly trying to break through to us, to overcome our limitations so that everyone can know God. Those who recognize God in the events of their lives can be called wise, like the gift-bearing men in the gospel. These wise men have read the signs well. With their gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh, they recognize the child as a king, over whose life the shadow of death is looming. We who read God's signs and understand are sent to manifest and share the blessings of God's Reign for all the nations and peoples of the world. Perhaps this is the only real gift we should give.

The Baptism of the Lord Jesus [January 9th] in the Jordan river reminds us to be responsible stewards of creation. Close to five million litres of water are taken from Wellington County daily for a water bottling plant. This extraction of large amounts of water adversely affects the ecological balance of nature over a large area while depriving those who rely on wells of their right to water. Close to seventy-five percent of plastic bottles end up in land fill sites, thus contributing to contamination of the soil for thousands of years. Bishop Douglas Crosby, OMI, urges all parishes in the Diocese of Hamilton to refrain from using bottled water in church facilities. As stewards of Creation may we be leaders in the responsible use of our sacred mandate.
