TENTH DAY OF THE LORD IN ORDINARY TIME

When I was a teenager, my favorite uncle passed away. He was only in his forties, and his death affected his mother—my grandmother greatly. Someone in the family said it wasn't right for a mother to have to bury her son.

That truth is part of today's Gospel. Jesus comes to a city called Nain as a dead man is being carried to his tomb: "the only son of his mother," Luke tells us, and "she was a widow."

You may know how the story ends: Jesus tells the grieving mother, "Do not weep." He calls to the dead man, "I tell you arise!" The dead man sits up, begins to speak, and Luke says Jesus gave him to his mother. The crowds acclaim Jesus as a prophet and declare, "God has visited his people."

Here beneath the drama of raising someone from the dead, Jesus restores the most basic of human relationships: a mother and a son.

God has indeed visited us, in the person of Jesus. Jesus embraces each of our relationships, heals them, and restores them to life. **He brings us into THE fundamental relationship which gives life—Father**, **Son**, and Holy Spirit--and invites us into that great **circle of life and love**. *Fr.
