

<u>Mother's Day</u> Pope Francis Writes: "LAUDATO SI', mi' Signore" – "Praise be to you, my Lord". In the words of this Saint Francis of Assisi rominds us that

beautiful canticle, Saint Francis of Assisi reminds us that our common home is like a sister with whom we share our life and a beautiful mother who opens her arms to embrace us. "Praise be to you, my Lord, through our Sister, **Mother Earth**, who sustains and governs us, and who produces various fruit with coloured flowers and herbs". Laudato Si' #1

Today we celebrate Mother's Day! Mothers care for us and nurture us throughout our lives! Perhaps today, take a moment to think about our Mother Earth, who provides us for all that we need to be alive, such as oxygen, oceans, rivers, lakes, trees, flowers, herbs, animals, food, shelter, etc. Think about how you might celebrate our Mother Earth as many others before us.

Sister Dorothy Stang, Sister of Notre Dame de Namur, is a woman who worked to support both the environment and the poor. She lived and worked with the poor in the Amazon Region, teaching local farmers about ecological sustainability and farmer's rights. She helped peasants make a living by farming small plots and extracting forest products without deforestation. On February 12, 2005, on the way to a meeting to address farmers on human rights issues, Sister Dorothy was killed by a local peasant because many people especially those involved in illegal logging and ranching did not approve of her work. The ministry of Sister Dorothy Stang is a clear reminder of what the mission of the Church ought to be: we are called to stand with those who are on the margins of society, to support the poor, the oppressed, and the endangered earth. MARRIAGE TIP OF THE MONTH: Two powerful indicators of the health of any relationship are how those involved communicate and settle conflict.
