Organization (WFTO) created the holiday World Fair Trade Day in 2004 and declared that it would be celebrated on the second Saturday of each May.

The concepts that drive Fair Trade Enterprises are focused on ensuring the well-being of the planet and those that inhabit it. Fair Trade promotes environmental sustainability and helps at-risk groups. It reduces poverty and improves the treatment of workers. Fair Trade Enterprises create a more equal and positive working situation for laborers around the world. Some examples of their business models include; recycling and upcycling, women-leadership, refugee-focused enterprises, preserving indigenous skills and much more.

WHY FAIR TRADE DAY IS IMPORTANT? THIS YEAR'S THEME IS CLIMATE JUSTICE!

- 1. It creates a more ethical world: When workers are paid fairly, they and their families can lead better lives. That leads to a healthier world, which benefits everyone. The fight for fair trade is a powerful eye-opener into some of the many other injustices in our world.
- 2. It reminds us not to take everyday products for granted: For each bag of coffee beans we bring home from the grocery store, there may be many laborers who were unfairly paid in the process of getting that product onto our store shelves. The convenience of the modern world makes it very easy to mindlessly consume, but it's always important to consider where our products come from. Behind every pair of jeans, packet of tea, or stack of candy bars we see on a store shelf, is a group of real people who worked hard to get those products there. It's our global responsibility to ensure that such laborers are working in safe conditions and are being paid enough to support themselves and their families.
- 3. It can benefit the environment: Companies that do not adhere to fair trade standards often create products at an unsustainable rate that does significant damage to the earth. A major tenet of fair trade is respect for the environment, and that's especially important in the face of climate change.
- 4. Buy fair trade products, purchasing at your local supermarket, be sure that the product is fair trade certified. If your local stores don't carry fair trade products, encourage them to do so, and explain the movement's benefits.
- 5. Attend a local fair trade event that calls attention to food and artisan products created under fair trade initiatives.
