ADVENT/CHRISTMAS/EPIPHANY

This liturgical season celebrates **the coming of Christ which fulfills our hope-filled longings.** It focuses on three aspects of the coming of Jesus Christ.

- 1. His final coming as the Son of Man in glory;
- 2. His first coming at his birth in Bethlehem;
- 3. His continuing coming to us in the sacraments and in his presence in us by grace.

During the liturgical year 2016-2017 we will be guided by reflection on the meaning for us of the Reign of God. The Church is not the Reign of God. The Church is the sign, instrument and foretaste of the Reign of God. Our theme this year will be:

TOGETHER IN GOD'S REIGN St. Mathew's Gospel will be our guiding good news this year. The Reign of God was already partially experienced by the People of God before the coming of Jesus. St. Matthew's Gospel illustrates how Jesus fulfills the development of the Reign of God [Kingdom of Heaven] foreshadowed and recorded in the Hebrew Scriptures. Some New Testament commentators have described a large part of St. Matthew's Gospel as "The Charter of the Reign of God". The Reign of God, announced by the prophet John the Baptist, began in conception and birth of Jesus Christ.

God's Reign touches our lives now, and will be fulfilled in the final coming of the Christ in glory. **Each weekend of Advent our liturgies will reflect on the unfolding of the Reign of God** prepared for among the People of God prior to Jesus and being fulfilled in His Advent. **Our theme for the Advent season** will be:

PREPARING TOGETHER FOR THE COMING OF GOD'S REIGN



FIRST DAY OF THE LORD IN ADVENT Be awake for the coming of the Reign of God. Especially the Gospel of Matthew and the Responsorial Psalm encourage us to

watch with alertness for the fullness of God's Reign in the final coming of the glorious Christ when God's steadfast love and plan of harmony for the universe is complete. The images from the book of the prophet Isaiah of walking in the light of the Lord where weapons of war are transformed into instruments of peace, urge us to be instruments of God's Reign now.

Pope Francis writes: "Love, over flowing with small gestures of mutual care, is also civic and political, and it makes itself felt in every action that seeks to build a

better world. Love for society and commitment to the common good are outstanding expressions of a charity which affects not only relationships between individuals but also "macro-relationships, social, economic and political ones".156 That is why the Church set before the world the ideal of a "civilization of love". 157 Social love is the key to authentic development: "In order to make society more human, more worthy of the human person, love in social life – political, economic and cultural – must be given renewed value, becoming the constant and highest norm for all activity".158 In this framework, along with the importance of little everyday gestures, social love moves us to devise larger strategies to halt environmental degradation and to encourage a "culture of care" which permeates all of society. When we feel that God is calling us to intervene with others in these social dynamics, we should realize that this too is part of our spirituality, which is an exercise of charity and, as such, matures and sanctifies us. " Laudato si #231
